

#### **Easter Sunday April 9th Reflection**

Dear Friends in Christ,

I would like to begin with a story about the Resurrection of Jesus Christ:

One brisk morning in Lent, a pastor was making his way across the playground of the parish school. All the while he would stop and ask some of the children about the importance of Easter. One child excitedly explained that Easter was the celebration of coloring eggs and eating all the chocolate we were not allowed to eat during lent. Another child quickly explained that Easter was a time when the Easter Bunny would go down the chimney bringing baskets filled with presents and candy for good children and coal for bad children. The pastor was growing weary that the children did not quite grasp the true meaning of Easter. Finally, the pastor asked one last student why Easter was so important. The boy said

confidently: "Easter is a time when Christians celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. He suffered a lot of pain, his friends ran away from him and then died on the Cross while his Mother cried at the foot of the Cross. Then, Jesus was placed in the tomb until he rose from the dead!" The teary-eyed-pastor was elated with joy to find at least one student who knew the importance of Easter. The boy continued: "But Father, is it true that if Jesus saw his shadow when He came out of the tomb winter will go on for six more weeks?"

It's just a story but, nevertheless, it begs the question whether or not we really understand the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. I think that we can all agree that in our culture we can see how these external devotions to the Easter bunny, colorful eggs, and Jellybeans often cast its own "shadow" on the real reason why we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Easter is a word that simply means: To the East or facing the Sunrise. This was the posture of those who stood facing the crucifixion of Jesus Christ on Good Friday 2000 years ago. That's right, the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. John and many other onlookers faced east when our Lord died on the cross. For two millennium facing the crucifix was an important posture for the priest while celebrating Mass. In fact many priests still face a crucifix on the altar during the celebration of the Mass.

Facing the cross is a hard discipline for us Christians. "God so loves the world that He would give us His only Son for the Salvation of the world" (John 3:16). The crucifix can also remind us death must come to all and that as disciples of Jesus Christ we must take up our own crosses and follow the Lord. Facing the crucifix is a serious action for the Mass as well as a powerful meditation on the importance to suffer well and to die well with the hope of living forever in the Resurrection of our Savior. Facing the crucifix also recalls the humility of Christ who forgave his enemies before He commended His spirit back to the Father (Luke 23:46).

The Eucharist is the true presence of Jesus in His glorious Resurrection. Just as GOD would humble Himself to become man, and Jesus would humble Himself to the Crucifixion, so the Lord continues to humble Himself in the appearance of bread and wine in the Holy Eucharist! Incredible! Yet, how do we respond to the Eucharist? Face the Crucifix! Be humble! Be ready to carry your own cross! Be patient! And most important: Be forgiving! In other words, GO TO MASS!

Brothers and Sisters, don't be afraid to face your Crosses! Jesus is always with us in the Holy Eucharist to help us through this dark valley and into the verdant pastures (Psalm 23). We can gain a lot of strength by facing the crucifix of our Savior. We need to be reminded of His courage! Likewise, Jesus will help us be courageous in caring our own crosses especially when we bring our cross to Mass, to the Eucharist. Then we can offer to God our suffering in the True Presence of the Lord in Holy Communion. The Eucharist will give us divine strength to accept and carry our own crosses. Yes, the Last Supper is the first Mass and the crucifixion and the Eucharist are intimately intertwined to show us the Resurrection of the Lord. The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is not without the cross. So our cross cannot be without the Resurrection of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. If you want to experience the Resurrection then come to Mass and be in Holy Communion with the Lord. Then you will have eternal life (John 6:54).
