

Reflection for Pentecost Sunday, May 28th, 2023 Receive the Holy Spirit

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost, the day the Holy Spirit came down upon the Apostles. As mentioned last week, Jesus ascends onto heaven, but first he promises to send the Spirit to the apostles to teach them all things.

What does it mean to send his Spirit? We'll start with a somewhat superficial, shallow image and build from there. Consider a football team. Suppose the coach is very emotional and high-strung. The players will become very excited and animated like him as they engage in play. Or consider the opposite, a coach who is very cold, deliberate, and calculating. His players will approach the game in a very methodical, calculating, and serious style. The coach remains on the sidelines; he does not play the game. But the players reflect his spirit, his character. He has imparted his spirit onto them.

When God sends his Spirit, he imparts a part of his being onto us. But it is far more than a coach influencing his team's behavior. To understand this, we need to review who is the Holy Spirit. One God and three Persons. The Persons are defined by their relationship with each other. The Father loves the Son. The Son loves the Father. The Holy Spirit is the love between the Father and the Son.

When God sends the Spirit, he is allowing us to enter into the love between the Father and the Son. And in allowing us to enter into this love, he is sharing his life with us. Consider creation. God creates by his mere word. He says, "Let there be light" and there is light. He says, "Let there be life in the oceans" and the seas are teeming with all sorts of creatures. He says, "Let there be life on land" and so it happens. But when it comes to creating us humans, he takes a different approach. He takes clay and molds it into a still-lifeless form. Then he breathes onto it and Adam is now alive. The word "Spirit" comes from a word that means "breath". Through this breath he imparts life onto us. We see God the Son doing the same thing with his apostles in the Gospel. He breathes onto them to empower them to forgive sins.

And what happens when God shares his life and love with us, when he breathes onto us? Look at the effect on his apostles after they receive the Spirit at Pentecost.

Ever since Jesus' baptism, the church has been in formation. The apostles listen to Jesus' preaching, they witness his miracles, and they live with him. This formation culminates in what is called the Pascal Mystery, the Last Supper, the Crucifixion, Resurrection, and Ascension of our Lord. Think of the church as the clay being molded as Adam was. But in a certain sense, the church is not alive yet, it is not animated. The apostles sometimes stumble with Jesus' teaching and fail to fully grasp his message. They abandon Jesus when the soldiers come to arrest him. And now they are afraid. They enclose themselves in a room praying but fearful to go out amongst the crowds, to proclaim the Good News and fulfill their mission.

And now the Spirit comes, and the change is dramatic. The Spirit imparts his gifts upon them: wisdom, knowledge, counsel, fortitude, understanding, piety, and fear of the Lord. And the apostles go out boldly now, unafraid to preach and proclaim the Gospel. They convert thousands to the Way of the Lord. Many will come to believe in Jesus and be saved by the apostles' powerful witness.

Now emboldened and fully animated by the Spirit, the apostles begin to display the effects of his presence, his life. Now we see in them what are called the fruits of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. The Church is truly alive and vibrant.

Pentecost is considered the day of the birth of the Church. May we celebrate it joyfully as we do any birthday occasion. But this is a time for more than rejoicing. May we be thankful for the presence of the Spirit in our own individual lives. May we commit anew to fully live the life the Spirit has imparted upon us.
