2025 Apple Ice Classic

I. COMPETITION OVERVIEW

The 2025 Apple Ice Classic will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the <u>current rulebook</u>, and/or <u>current Compete USA handbook</u> as well as any pertinent updates that have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating <u>website</u>.

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules.

Skaters must be a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, a Learn to Skate USA member, a collegiate club or who is an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. For non-U.S. citizens, please refer to the rulebook for more information.

2025 PNW BASIC SKILL SERIES:

AIC is an approved competition for 2025 PNW Basic Skills Series. If you are signed up with PNW Basic Skill Series, your scores will be sent to PNIC. If you have not signed up, you need to sign up before you compete. Skaters must compete in a minimum of three (3) competitions. This year's series will include competitions at PNIC and OSC Clubs and/or associated rink LTS programs from Oct 24, 2024 through Aug 17, 2025 (see website for approved competitions). Invitations to our PNW Basic Skills Series Championship will be sent out by August 30, 2025. Click here for more PNW Basic Skills Series information.

II. ELIGIBILITY

Singles: Excel and Well-Balanced Events:

- Skaters must meet at least the minimum singles test requirements for the event's level. A skater's singles test level may be higher than the minimum requirement.
- Skate Up: skaters may skate up one level higher than their minimum test requirement allows.
- Skaters may not register for an event level lower than allowed by their competitive floor. An athlete's competitive floor is set by one of the following scenarios:
 - If an athlete has a paid EMS series application for the NQS series, the event level registered for in the
 most recent NQS will become the lowest level they may compete at in any U.S. Figure Skating
 sanctioned event.
 - If an athlete has a paid EMS series application for the Excel Series, the event level registered for in the most recent Excel series will become the lowest level they may compete in any Excel event. For Well-Balanced and Specialty events the skater will be permitted to register at one level lower than the "floor" set by their excel series entry.
 - If an athlete has never had a paid EMS series application in the NQS or Excel series, the athlete may select their level based on their goals and technical skills as long as the minimum test requirements are met.
- Skaters are not permitted to enter an Excel free skate and a Well-Balanced free skate event at the same competition (example: Juvenile Girls Free Skate and Juvenile Girls Excel Free Skate). However, they are permitted to enter an Excel and a Well-Balanced event of different types such as a short program (if stand-alone event option), specialty or showcase events (example: Intermediate Women Short Program and Intermediate Women Excel Free Skate).

All other singles and partner events (such as Adults, Pairs, Ice Dance):

- Skaters must meet the minimum test requirements for the events level, but not exceed the maximum permissible test requirement.

- For synchronized skating teams, this competition does not require that skating skills test requirements for the team's level be met, except for the maximum allowed at the Compete USA levels (Snowplow Sam Synchro and Aspire levels).

COMPLIANCE:

COACHES:

To be an eligible coach at a nonqualifying competition, coaches must meet the applicable compliance requirements and verified by U.S. Figure Skating. Coach compliance falls into two categories, Coach Compliance (includes choreographers) and Learn to Skate USA® Instructor Compliance. Details regarding compliance requirements can be found <u>HERE</u>. All compliance requirements must be met at the time of check-in to access the competition, no exceptions.

Coaches of foreign athletes: If you are a coach of a foreign athlete only, you are not subject to U.S. Figure Skating coach compliance and will only be asked to provide a letter of good standing for the federation your athlete represents.

TEAM SERVICE PERSONNEL:

Teams are permitted a maximum of two team service personnel. Team service personnel must have a current U.S. Figure Skating or Learn to Skate USA® membership, a green lighted background check and completed SafeSport™ Training. All compliance requirements must be met at the time of check-in to access the competition, no exceptions. Team service personnel is defined as those indicated as a team manager and/or team service personnel planning to attend the competition with the team.

MANDATORY ATHLETES:

Athletes age 18+ as of the competition start date who will be competing on a team (i.e., synchro, ice dance, pairs, shadow dance, theatre, etc.) with at least one Minor Athlete must complete SafeSport™ Training. *

Minor athletes who turn 18 mid-season are encouraged to seek parental consent to take the online SafeSport™ Training early to avoid any disruptions in their ability to participate as the training is required upon turning 18. The athlete will not be compliant until they have completed the training and their Members Only portal reflects completion. Please email skatesafe@usfigureskating.org for instructions or questions regarding parental consent.

III. REGISTRATION INFORMATION

ONLINE REGISTRATION VIA ENTRYEEZE:





Online registrations will be accepted via Entryeeze. Payment must be made at the time of registration by <u>credit card only</u>. Each transaction includes a transaction fee. **NOTE: All registered skaters will receive a link to a video of the skater's performance(s) provided by a professional videographer, after the competition is completed.**

Registration Deadline: July 15, 2025, at 11:59pm PT

Late Registration Deadline: July 22, 2025, at 8:59pm PT + \$35 Late Fee

TEST CREDIT:

Sign-up for Test Credit through Entryeeze online registration is available at an additional \$25 fee. **Test Packets must** be bought before the deadline of registration. Test Credit Packets will be handed out after the event is done, and the event results have been posted. Test Credit is only available for Excel/Well Balanced Free Skate Program Juvenile and up.

MUSIC SUBMISSION/UPLOAD:

MUSIC UPLOAD: Competitors participating in events with music are required to upload their music to Entryeeze no later than close of registration **July 15, 2025, 11:59pm PT**. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature and subject to a \$35 late fee. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

MUSIC CRITERIA:

- File Format: MP3
- Bit Rate: 192 kbps or higher and Sample Rate: 44,100 kHz
 - This will be verified by the music chair, and they may request you upload a corrected file.
- Leaders and trailers (the silence or "dead space" before and after the actual start and end of the program music) may not exceed two (2) seconds. We prefer that there be NO leaders or trailers at all. Excessive leaders and trailers may disrupt the playing of the music during competition.

Competitors must also have available a backup copy of their competition music on a cell phone and it must be immediately available rink side whenever the skater competes. If the phone does not have the standard round headset connector, an appropriate adapter, such as an Apple Lightning connector or Samsung USB-C adapter is required to be attached. The phone should be presented to the music person with the file ready to play, phone in airplane mode and volume turned to maximum.

SOLO DANCE:

Solo Dance is not part of the 2025 Solo Dance Series. Competitors will need to upload their choice of music for each Solo Dance event as outlined in the Music Submission/Upload section above.

PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT (PPC) SUBMISSION/UPLOAD - FOR IJS EVENTS ONLY:

PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT (PPC) – Competitors participating in IJS events are required to submit PPC in Entryeeze no later than **July 15, 2025, 11:59pm**. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature and subject to a \$35 late fee. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

REFUND POLICY

Entry fees will not be refunded after entry deadline unless no competition exists or the event is canceled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals.

IV. COMPETITION DETAILS

FACILITIES:

The ice surfaces are 85' X 200', with slightly rounded corners. The arena viewing area is a comfortable temperature

for viewers. This information will be posted on the WFSC website once finalized.

LOCKER ROOMS AND CHANGING AREAS:

Locker rooms and changing areas will not be available for this competition. All athletes are expected to arrive at the arena ready (costumes, hair, make-up etc.). Athletes will be provided with an area to put skates on but changing will not be permitted in these spaces. Mats and seating will be available outside of the credentialed access area for those skaters that need help with their skates.

U.S. FIGURE SKATING TRAVEL POLICY:

All travel must strictly adhere to Two-Deep Leadership requirements. An Adult Participant cannot transport a Minor Athlete one-on-one and Two-Deep Leadership requirements must be adhered to at all times during In-Program travel, by transporting at least two minors or a second Adult Participant. An Adult Participant cannot share a hotel room or other sleeping arrangement with a Minor Athlete(s). Full details of the SkateSafe Travel Policy and any exceptions can be found starting on page 12 of the SkateSafe Handbook.

OFFICIAL WEBSITE & UPDATES:

An official bulletin board will be maintained near registration. It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent, and coach to check the bulletin board frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information. Skaters are requested to arrive 45 minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event. A tentative schedule of events will be posted prior to the competition. All starting orders and results will be posted online. A QR code will be provided at the registration desk and on the WFSC website.

SCHEDULE

Competitors may be scheduled on any day or time during the announced dates of the competition. The competition and practice ice schedule will be available after the close of entries. All participants will be notified via email once available.

PRACTICE ICE:

Practice Ice must be purchased at time of registration. The practice ice sessions will be \$20 per 20-minute session. Practice ice is initially limited to one session per entered event. Production Team practice is \$75 for a 15-minute session. After the schedule is determined, extra practice ice will be sold on a first-come first-serve basis. Skaters must check in with the ice monitor prior to taking the ice. No refunds will be given to those who do not attend their reserved practice ice. A \$5 change fee will be assessed for switching practice ice sessions at the registration desk.

AWARDS:

Awards for 1st through 6th for all events will be presented at the awards/photography area on the concourse immediately following the official posting of each event. Award photos can be taken on the awards platform at your leisure.

All other videotaping and photography is restricted to hand-held battery-operated equipment, without tripod, and is permissible only in the general viewing area. Video recording or photography of any skater other than your own is strictly prohibited. Please be courteous to those viewing the event. Solicitation by any photographer or agent of anyone to be the subject of still or video photography is not permitted. For safety reasons, no flash photography is allowed during the event.
