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1 Welcome

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Wylam Rockets exists to encourage and enable young people within our community to participate in organised football activity. The club aims to develop football skills and participate in competitive matches. We pride ourselves on our inclusive approach regardless of ability, promoting positive values such as fair play, selflessness, club loyalty, mutual support, self-discipline and respect.

We have achieved a lot since the club was founded in 2003. The club has grown to include 7 teams, with playing opportunities for over 140 children and young people and we play mixed teams, boys and girls teams from under 7s through to under 16s. To enable Wylam Rockets to continue successfully, we also hope that you will come to play a full and active part within the club, particularly in helping it to evolve in a way which meets your needs, and more importantly those of the children and young people.

2.5 Ethos

The Club is open to all people regardless of their ability, gender, race, ethnicity, sexuality, social/ economic status. This applies to all members of the Club, young people players and adult volunteers including committee members, coaches, team helpers and parents and guardians.

The Club provides an emphasis on football-skills development geared to the needs and abilities of the individual child, and on stimulating and fostering their enthusiasm for and understanding of the 'beautiful game'. The Club also provide opportunities for young players to become involved in competitive football. Here the emphasis is on striving to maximise squad and team achievement whilst promoting and developing positive individual and group values such as fair play, selflessness, club loyalty, mutual support, self-discipline and respect for ones' team-mates, the opposition and match officials.

The Club prides itself on its inclusive approach regardless of ability – the Club does not run "trials" each year but looks to accept all local boys and girls who approach the Club wanting to play football. The only constraint to accepting additional boys and girls is the limit of appropriate squad sizes given the relatively small, but growing, number of qualified coaches attached to the Club.

3 Joining the Club

3.1 Recruitment

Contact the Club Secretary or the appropriate coach for your age group. Your child is welcome to attend a few introductory training sessions before deciding to join the Wylam Rockets.

Training is usually held on a Wednesday night or Friday night.

The team will be managed by an FA qualified coach, who also has DBS clearance, safeguarding and first aid training. They may be supported by a Team Assistant, who has also undergone DRB clearance.

3.2 Subscription

The subscription for the season is £180. We expect players who train with us for the majority of the season (i.e. to the end of January) to pay in full. The Season is from 1st September through to the date of the FA Cup Final in May the following year. Subscription of £180 can be paid in full at the start of the season (1st September) or at £20 per month for 9 months via direct debit. Any refunds or cancellations to subscriptions must be approved by the Treasurer. Late joiners are expected to pay the full season subscription. **The subscription instructions** are at the end of this pack.

Please be aware that following reasonable requests and reminders for subs your child may be removed from training and matches. All players must be registered with the club for insurance purposes, and club registration is only valid for players whose subs are up to date.

3.3 Registration

Players who chose to play competitively will be registered in an appropriate league. You will be asked by your coach for an online registration and will need to provide a FAN number and date of birth. Our coaches will be able to advise you regarding this. Your coach will inform you about your league and any forthcoming matches.

3.4 Kit

- Our intention is to provide a full playing kit each player at a minimum every other season
- Purchasing kit is the responsibility of the Coach, with support from the Kit Officer

We welcome **kit sponsorship** from “age- appropriate” sponsors that are considered suitable within FA Guidelines for Sponsors. Please contact the Treasurer or Kit officer if you would like to discuss this.

4 Communication and Data Privacy

All communication with generally be via email from your team coach/admin. We have an official Website and Wylam Rockets Facebook page for club announcements and news.

We take your privacy very seriously. This Privacy Notice sets out how we use and look after the personal information we collect from you. We are the data controller, responsible for the processing of any personal data you give us. We take reasonable care to keep your information secure and to prevent any unauthorised access to or use of it.

Personal data means any information about an individual from which that individual can be identified. We collect, use, store and transfer some personal data from our participants [and their parents or guardians], and other Club members such as parent helpers.

You provide information about yourself when you register with the Club, and by filling in forms at an event or online, or by corresponding with us by phone, email or otherwise.

The information you give us may include your name, date of birth, address, email address, phone number, gender, and the contact details of a third party in the case of emergency. We may also ask for relevant health information, which is classed as special category personal data, for the purposes of your health, wellbeing, welfare and safeguarding. Where we hold this data, it will be with the explicit consent of the participant or, if applicable, the participant's parent or guardian.

Where we need to collect personal data to fulfil Club responsibilities and you do not provide that data, we may not be able honour or administer your membership.

We will only use personal data for any purpose for which it has been specifically provided.

The reason we need participants' and members' personal data is to be able to run the club and arrange matches; to administer memberships, and

provide the membership services you are signing up to when you register with the club. Our lawful basis for processing your personal data is that we have a contractual obligation to you as a participant or member to provide the services you are registering for.

In summary these reasons will include:

- Processing memberships, payments and subs
- Organising matches and training sessions
- Sending out club/squad/team information
- Sharing with leagues, county associations and tournament providers
- Sharing with committee members to provide information about wider club activities

When you become a member of the Club, your information, if you are a coach or volunteer will be or if you are another participant may be (depending upon which league(s) your team plays in) entered onto the Whole Game System database, which is administered by the FA. We also pass your information to the County FA and to leagues to register participants and the team for matches, tournaments or other events, and for affiliation purposes.

We may share your personal data with selected third parties, suppliers and sub-contractors such as referees, coaches or match organisers. Third-party service providers will only process your personal data for specified purposes and in accordance with our instructions.

We may disclose your personal information to third parties to comply with a legal obligation; or to protect the rights, property, or safety of our participants, members or affiliates, or others.

The Club's data processing may require your personal data to be transferred outside of the UK. Where the Club does transfer your personal data overseas it is with the sufficient appropriate safeguards in place to ensure the security of that personal data.

We have put in place appropriate security measures to prevent your personal data from being accidentally lost, used or accessed in an unauthorised way, altered or disclosed.

We keep personal data on our participants and members while they continue to be a participant or member or are otherwise actively involved with the Club. We will delete this data 2 years after a participant or member has left or otherwise ended their membership or affiliation, or sooner if specifically requested and we are able to do so. We may need to retain some personal data for longer for legal or regulatory purposes. The personal data that is stored on Whole Game System is subject to their privacy policy so we advise you review that policy together with this notice. If you would like your personal data to be deleted from Whole Game System then please contact them.

As a data subject you may have the right at any time to request access to, rectification or erasure of your personal data; to restrict or object to certain kinds of processing of your personal data, including direct marketing; to the portability of your personal data and to complain to the UK's data protection supervisory authority, the Information Commissioner's Office about the processing of your personal data.

As a data subject you are not obliged to share your personal data with the Club. If you choose not to share your personal data with us we may not be able to register or administer your membership.

We may update this Privacy Notice from time to time and will inform you to any changes in how we handle your personal data.

5 Respect Code of Conduct for Youth Players

We all have a responsibility to promote high standards in the game.

As a player, you have a big part to play. That's why the FA asks every player to follow a Respect Code of Conduct.

Wylam Rockets is an FA Charter Standard Club, and asks all players to sign-up to this code.

When playing football, I will:

- Always play to the best of my ability
- Play fairly – I won't cheat, complain or waste time.
- Respect my team mates, the other team, referee and my coach
- Play by the rules, as directed by the referee
- Shake hands with the other team and referee at the end of the game
- Listen and respond to what my coach tells me
- Talk to someone I trust or the club welfare officer if I am unhappy about anything at my club.

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by my club, County FA or The FA.

I may:

- Be required to apologise to my team mates, the other team, referee or coach
- Receive formal warning from the coach or the club committee
- Be dropped or substituted
- Be suspended from training
- Be required to leave the club.

In addition:

- My club, County FA or The FA may make my parent or carer aware of any infringements of the Code of Conduct
- The FA/County FA could impose a fine and suspension against my club.

6 Respect Code of Conduct for Parents / Spectators

We all have a responsibility to promote high standards in the game. As a Charter Standard club, Wylam Rockets is supporting The FA's Respect programme to ensure football can be enjoyed in a safe, positive environment.

Remember children's football is a time for them to develop their technical, physical, tactical and social skills. Winning isn't everything. Play your part and observe The FA's Respect Code of Conduct for spectators and parents / carers at all times.

I will:

- Remember that children play for FUN
- Applaud effort and good play as well as success
- Always respect the match official's decisions
- Remain outside the field of play and within the Designated Spectator's Area (where provided)
- Let the coach do their job and not confuse the players by telling them what to do
- Encourage players to respect the opposition, referee and match officials

- Avoid criticising a player for making a mistake – mistakes are part of learning
- Never engage in, or tolerate offensive, insulting, or abusive behaviour.

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by my club, County FA, league or The FA.

I may be:

- Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official
- Required to meet with the club, league or CFA Welfare Officer
- Required to meet with the club committee
- Obligated to undertake an FA education course
- Obligated to leave the match venue by the club
- Requested by the club not attend future games
- Suspend or have my club membership removed
- Required to leave the club along with any dependents

In addition:

- The FA/County FA could impose a fine and/or suspension against the club.

*Note that students aged sixteen or over can provide their own consent.

There will be occasions when we may take, or authorise the taking of, photographs and videos of the players while at training, in matches or at events associated with our club. We (or our sponsors) may use these images on our social media pages or on our website or in other club related offline and online documents.

We do not authorise the sharing of photographs of players taken by parents and/or other spectators at Rockets events. Please only publish photographs of your own children on social media.

There is a journalistic exemption with regard to the media, and occasionally players' images may appear in local or national newspapers, or on televised

news programmes. Please indicate if you wish your child to appear in the media, if not we will try to keep your child out of any photographs.

Please note that websites can be viewed throughout the world and not just in the United Kingdom where UK law applies.

Conditions of Use

This form is valid for five years from the date you sign it, or for the period of time your child is a member of the club. The consent will automatically expire after this time.

- We will not re-use any photographs or recordings after your student leaves the club.
- We will not use the full name or any other personal details of any child in or with a photographic image or video without first seeking your specific consent.
- We may use photographs of or videos of squad, team or groupings of players with very general labels, such as 'U8 Rockets win the cup at Blackpool'.
- We will only use images of players who are suitably dressed, in Rockets/Rockettes kit.
- We will not remove historical images from social media, our website or in club documentation and we have no control over whether images that have been made publicly available are copied and stored by third parties.

9 Wylam Rockets Subscriptions – Guidance for Families

A season subscription to Wylam Rockets for each player is £180.

The season is 1st September until the date of the FA Cup final in May the following year. The subscription is paid by direct debit of £20 per month for 9 months September through to and including May the following year. Subscription can also be paid in full at the beginning of the year.

This subscription covers all costs including pitch maintenance and hire, playing strips, footballs, equipment, league fees, referees fees, entry to tournaments, training for coaches etc, so represents excellent value for money.

Please also note that all officials in the club including the coaching staff offer their services on a voluntary basis so all subscriptions are used to benefit of the players.

Direct Debit is our preferred means of payment for subs, if you wish to pay by any other means please contact the Subs Officer or Treasurer and suitable arrangements can be made. If for any reason payments present a difficulty, please contact either the Subs Officer, Treasurer, your Coach, or our Welfare Officers who will deal with any such issues in a confidential manner.

Please complete the form using the first and last name of the bank account holder that the payment is to be taken from, we will add the player's name later on.

This will result in an email to the Subs Officer. No payments will be taken from your account until we have allocated you to your squad's payment plan.

Your first payment will be taken on the 7th day of the following month, and every 7th day following while your child remains a Rocket.

You will not be notified that a payment is to be taken. You will see 'GoCardless - WYLAMROCKETS' as the reference on your Bank Statement.

9.2 Players Leaving

This can happen mid-season for individual players, and at the end of the season for retiring teams.

If players leave the club before the 31st January, a minimum of 5 days notice is required to cancel a future direct debit payment. So as Subs are to be taken on the 7th of the month, then cancellation must be requested and agreed by the end of the previous month.

If players wish to leave the club after 1st February, the outstanding subscription will need to be paid for the remainder of the season.

- Please inform your coach and/or Subs Officer with a request to stop payments
- The Subs Officer will confirm your request with the relevant coach/admin if necessary
- The Subs Officer will inform you when the last payment will be taken

When a full squad is to retire at the end of a season the coach/admin will inform the families when payments will stop following discussion with the Subs Officer.

9.3 One-off Payment Requests

These will occur for the following reasons and will only relate to a small subset of families. They will be for a single payment to be taken in the following month and families will be informed of the amount and the date in advance:

- Kit contribution
- Contribution to an event such as a tournament
- Subs arrears

By signing up to the Wylam Rockets Direct Debit scheme families agree to:
