

# Special Guest Speaker Dave Washburn on the Spanish-American War at March 11<sup>th</sup> Meeting



ou will not want to miss David Washburn at our general meeting March 11th at 7 pm. This meeting will be at our museum on Canton Center Rd., corner of Heritage Drive.

Many of the events of the Spanish-American War took place about one hundred years ago. To commemorate this event Dave has consented to speak to our historical society. All guests are welcome and refreshments will be served.

Dave has extensive knowledge and many artifacts of our country's history of this era. The Declaration of War was April 21, 1898 and the

Peace Protocol was signed Dec. 10, 1898. The Protocol was adopted in January of 1899. Michigan's five volunteer regiments were 31 through 35. The numbering of these volunteer regiments was a continuation from the Civil War. Three of the regiments were actively involved in the War. The 33rd and 34th regiments saw action while the 31st was involved in the occupation of Cuba. Some states had as many as ten regiments and none saw action during the actual five months of war. Michigan had three men killed in the conflict. One man from Port Huron, Alfred Polond, received the Medal of Honor. He was with the 10th U.S. Infantry. The Michigan volunteers fought in Cuba along with other volunteers from New York, Massachusetts and the regulars of the 5th U.S. Army Corps.

Mr. Washburn has an extensive uniform collection, which includes Spanish uniforms as well as U.S. uniforms.

Please plan to attend this special event hosted by your Canton Historical Society.





## December 5th Christmas Bake Sale Well Attended




## Canton's Country Schools
