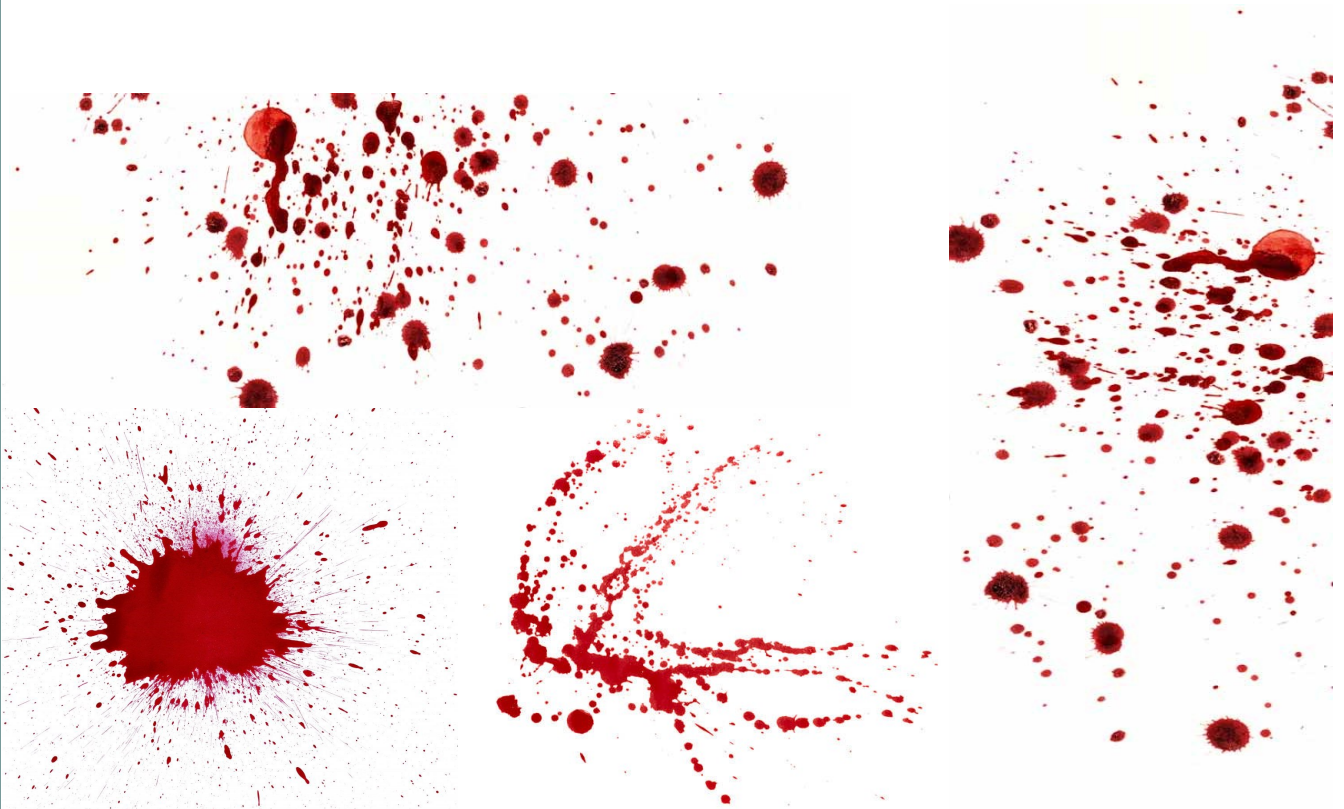


About the Instructor:
