Annually law enforcement receives about 100,000 reports of attempted stranger child abductions. On average, every year, 58,000 children are abducted by non-family members and sadly, over 100 of these children are murdered.

Did you Know? In child abduction murder cases:

60% of the time there is a delay of two hours or more before the police are notified.

58% of the time the child is reported to the police as Missing or Runaway.

74% of the time, the child was murdered within three (3) hours of the abduction.

43% of the time, the child has been murdered before law enforcement is notified.

74% of the time, the name of the killer appears in the police case report within the first seven (7) days of the investigation.

The in-depth two (2) day class will cover the initial response, preliminary investigation, and the extended investigation of abducted children. The class is appropriate for all police officers.
