Course Information: This is a comprehensive class on how to properly conduct compliance checks to effectively enforce age restrictions on liquor and tobacco. This 4-hour class is for law enforcement officers responsible for supervising compliance testing for alcohol and tobacco laws. This program includes sample police policy and procedures, case law, and national guidelines to ensure police compliance testing passes judicial review. Specific recommendations are given to ensure community, media, and merchant support for your enforcement program. The multi-media presentation covers national policy and court rulings on proper underage compliance check operations.

Resume: Kenneth Williams is an eight-year veteran of the Illinois Liquor Control Commission's (ILCC) Enforcement Division. Kenny has spent the last 3 years assigned as one of four Supervisors in the State, supervising a unit of up to 6 Special Agents. In May 2018, he was temporarily assigned to lead the Enforcement Division as the Chief of Enforcement.

During his time with ILCC, Kenny has also led the development and instruction of the local liquor inspection program which ran from 2016 through July of 2019. This program trained local agencies, including health departments, sheriff's departments, and police departments, to conduct field compliance inspections of licensed liquor establishments on behalf of the ILCC. This program trained over 70 agencies statewide to conduct these inspections.

Kenny graduated from Parkland College with an A.A in Criminal Justice Studies and Southern Illinois University – Carbondale with a B.A. degree in Administration of Justice and Sociology. Kenny is an ILETSB-certified law enforcement officer in Illinois. He is a member of the National Liquor Law Enforcement Association, including a membership in the Direct-to-Consumer Workgroup, which is working to coordinate law enforcement response to issues involving direct shipment of alcoholic liquors to consumers.
