German Cockroach Preparation Sheet

These instructions should be followed for an effective service.

Please make sure in the kitchen area that cabinets & drawers are cleaned out. Counter tops need to be cleared off. The items can be put on the table or in plastic bins and covered. Avoid using corrugated cardboard boxes since roaches hid in these. Do not put bins in front of the cabinets. After the treatment do not wash out the cabinets & drawers. It is encouraged to vacuum cabinets of food debris prior to service.

Please make sure we have at least 2 feet of access to all wall areas. If the items are not movable, we will try to work around them the best we can.

In the bathroom area, put the soap & toothbrushes in Ziploc bags and seal them. If there is a closet or vanity, take the items out and put them in the tub. They may be put back when you return.

If there is a fish tank, please shut off the filters & air pumps and make sure it is covered with a wet towel.

Cover any open food or items which may be placed directly to the mouth.

If roaches are being seen in the bedrooms, the dresser drawers need to be cleaned out. The items can be put on the bed and covered.

Pregnant women and infants must vacate the treated areas for <u>6 or more</u> <u>hours</u> after treatment. All others must vacate for a minimum of <u>4 hours</u>.

What to expect after service:

It takes several weeks or longer to eliminate German roaches based on their life cycle span. Live roaches may be sighted up until the third week after service. After the first week you may experience an increase of live roaches as the products are formulated to agitate the roaches and draw them out of hiding harborage. After the second week there will be less roaches seen.
