It will soon be three years since the first shipment of 1,000 kits organized by Dignity4Girls arrived in Liberia in 2019 (photo above). Liberian school girls giggled at first to have their teachers talk about menstruation but soon appreciated the open discussions and answering of questions. Efforts to begin sewing classes in schools have been delayed due to COVID-19.
