



Tips For Traveling with a baby

In-Flight Tips

- **Seat Selection:** Choose the middle and aisle seats if traveling with someone; this may give you more space.
- **Bottles During Takeoff/Landing:** Have a bottle or sippy cup ready to help your baby's ears adjust to the pressure changes.
- **Keep Extra Clothes Handy:** Store extra clothes for your baby (and yourself) in an easily accessible part of your carry-on.
- **Bring Toys:** Use toys that can stick to the window or tray table to keep your baby entertained.
- **Use a Baby Carrier:** Keep your hands free and your baby secure while boarding, deplaning, or during a layover.
- **Use a Travel Pillow and Blanket:** Make napping more comfortable for your baby by having a travel Boppy pillow and a soft blanket.

Post-Flight Tips

- **Car Seat Handling:** If you gate-checked your car seat, pick it up immediately after deplaning. If you checked it at the counter, retrieve it from the baggage claim.
- **Renting a Car Seat:** If you didn't bring a car seat, make sure to arrange a rental ahead of time, preferably with a service that delivers it to the airport.
- **Portable Crib or Dock-A-Tot:** If your accommodation doesn't provide a crib, ensure your portable crib or Dock-A-Tot is set up securely for a safe sleeping environment.
- **Reassemble Stroller:** If you gate-checked your stroller, it should be waiting for you outside the plane. Reassemble it quickly to transport your baby and luggage through the airport.

Road Trip Tips

Plan Frequent Stops

- **Regular Breaks:** Aim to stop every two to three hours to let your baby stretch, move around, and have diaper changes. This will help keep them comfortable and prevent restlessness.
- **Baby-Friendly Locations:** Plan your stops at rest areas, parks, or even quiet roadside spots where your baby can get some fresh air and you can have a relaxing break.

Pack an Organized Diaper Bag

- **Essentials at Hand:** Keep diapers, wipes, a changing pad, and plastic bags for soiled items easily accessible. Make sure everything is organized so you can quickly grab what you need during stops.
- **Extra Clothes:** Pack at least one extra outfit for your baby (and possibly for yourself) in case of spills or accidents.

Keep the Car Comfortable

- **Car Seat Comfort:** Make sure your baby's car seat is correctly installed and provides good support. Consider using a soft cover or padding to make it more comfortable.
- **Sun Protection:** Use a sunshade on the windows to block out direct sunlight, keeping your baby cool and comfortable.
- **Temperature Control:** Keep the car at a comfortable temperature, and have a light blanket handy in case your baby needs it.

Prepare for Entertainment

- **Interactive Toys:** Bring a selection of your baby's favorite toys, along with some new ones to keep them engaged. Toys that attach to the car seat or that have different textures and sounds can be particularly useful.
- **Music and Stories:** Play soft music, nursery rhymes, or even baby-friendly podcasts to keep your little one entertained. You can also sing songs or talk to your baby about the passing scenery.

Snacks and Feeding

- **Easy-to-Grab Snacks:** Pack snacks that are easy for you to eat while driving and are suitable for your baby if they're old enough. Keep them within reach so you can quickly grab them during the trip.
- **Feeding Breaks:** Plan your stops around feeding times if possible, to minimize disruptions and keep your baby satisfied.

Be Flexible with Your Schedule

- **Expect the Unexpected:** Be prepared for delays or changes in plans. If your baby needs an extra stop or a longer break, be flexible and adjust your schedule as needed.
- **Avoid Rigid Timelines:** Allow extra time for your journey to accommodate your baby's needs without the pressure of a strict schedule.

Safety First

- **Car Seat Safety:** Double-check that your baby's car seat is installed correctly and that the harness is secure. Avoid placing heavy items near the car seat that could become hazardous in an accident.
- **Emergency Kit:** Keep a small first-aid kit in the car, along with baby-specific items like pain reliever, a thermometer, and any necessary medications.

Stay Rested and Alert

- **Driver Switch-Offs:** If traveling with another adult, switch driving duties regularly to stay alert. Make sure you're well-rested before starting the trip.
- **Breaks for You:** Use the stops not just for your baby's sake but for your own. Stretch, hydrate, and take a few minutes to recharge so you can drive safely.

Navigation and Directions

- **Plan the Route:** Map out your route ahead of time, and mark rest stops, baby-friendly locations, and emergency services along the way.
- **GPS and Backup:** Use a GPS for real-time directions but have a backup map or printed directions in case of technology failures.

“Traveling with a Baby” Packing Checklist

- ☐ Stroller 🛒: A lightweight, foldable stroller that can be gate-checked.
- ☐ Baby Carrier 👶: Comfortable and easy to wear for boarding, deplaning, and walking through the airport.
- ☐ Bottles/Sippy Cups 🍼: At least two, pre-filled for takeoff and landing.
- ☐ Toys 🎲: Sticky or suction cup toys that can attach to the window or tray table.
- ☐ Travel Boppy Pillow 🛌: For napping and feeding support.
- ☐ Blanket 🧸: A small, cozy blanket for warmth and comfort.
- ☐ Diapers 🍌: Pack enough for the entire journey, plus extra for delays.
- ☐ Wipes 🍷: For diaper changes and general cleanup.
- ☐ Extra Clothes 👕: For both baby and parents in case of spills or accidents.
- ☐ Changing Pad 🛏: A portable, foldable pad for diaper changes on the go.
- ☐ Snacks 🍏: Non-perishable, easy-to-eat snacks for both you and your baby.
- ☐ Plastic Bags 🛍: For soiled clothes, diapers, and trash.
- ☐ First Aid Kit 🩹: Basic supplies including band-aids, baby-safe pain reliever, and antiseptic wipes.
- ☐ Hand Sanitizer 🧴: For quick clean-ups.
- ☐ Sunshade ☀️: For the car seat or stroller to block out sunlight.
- ☐ Noise-Canceling Headphones 🎧: To protect your baby's ears and help with sleeping.
- ☐ Pacifiers 🍬: If your baby uses them, bring a couple of spares.
- ☐ Travel Documents 📄: Passports, boarding passes, and any necessary identification.
- ☐ Portable Crib or Dock-A-Tot 🛏: If your destination doesn't have a crib available.
- ☐ Car Seat 🚗: In a protective bag, or make arrangements to rent one at your destination.
