






# The School Doors Opened and Before We Knew It



Registration day gave students who desired last minute schedule changes a chance to make them. It also gave these students the opportunity to make final preparations for the '59-'60 school year.







On Friday afternoon there will be a parade featuring the queen candidates riding in five convertibles. The dates riding in five convertibles, football team and the entire student body will join the line of march.

Friday night the Bulldogs traveled to Monticello where they whipped their arch rivals, the Sages, 27-0 before a large homecoming crowd.

The triple threat of good blocking, hard running, and sharp tackling gave the Bulldogs a decisive victory, one of the biggest in Bement-Monticello football history.

The first quarter saw no scoring. In the second quarter, however, John Durbin found running room and dashed 25 yards for a T. D. John Pope kicked the extra point to end the first half scoring.

Bement came back strong in the second half and Durbin was able to score on a 10 yard run in the third quarter and on a 13 yard run in the fourth quarter. Pope again kicked both extra points. The scoring and the game were ended in the fourth quarter as Jack Walsh recovered a Monticello fumble in the end zone for a score.

The game was not all roses. In the first quarter Bruce Jordan, the Bulldogs' halfback, fumbled a broken left collar bone which will keep him from seeing any further action


