We are proud of our faculty who are the guideposts along our pathway through high school. Without them, our trek would be futile.














Coach Fredenberger explains a change in strategy to quarterback Dave Marker during a time-out.













The old records had been 21.7 seconds in the low hurdles and 20'3 1/2" in the broad jump. By also gaining points in the pole vault and the 120 yard high hurdles, Larry became the high scorer for the Bull-dogs.
