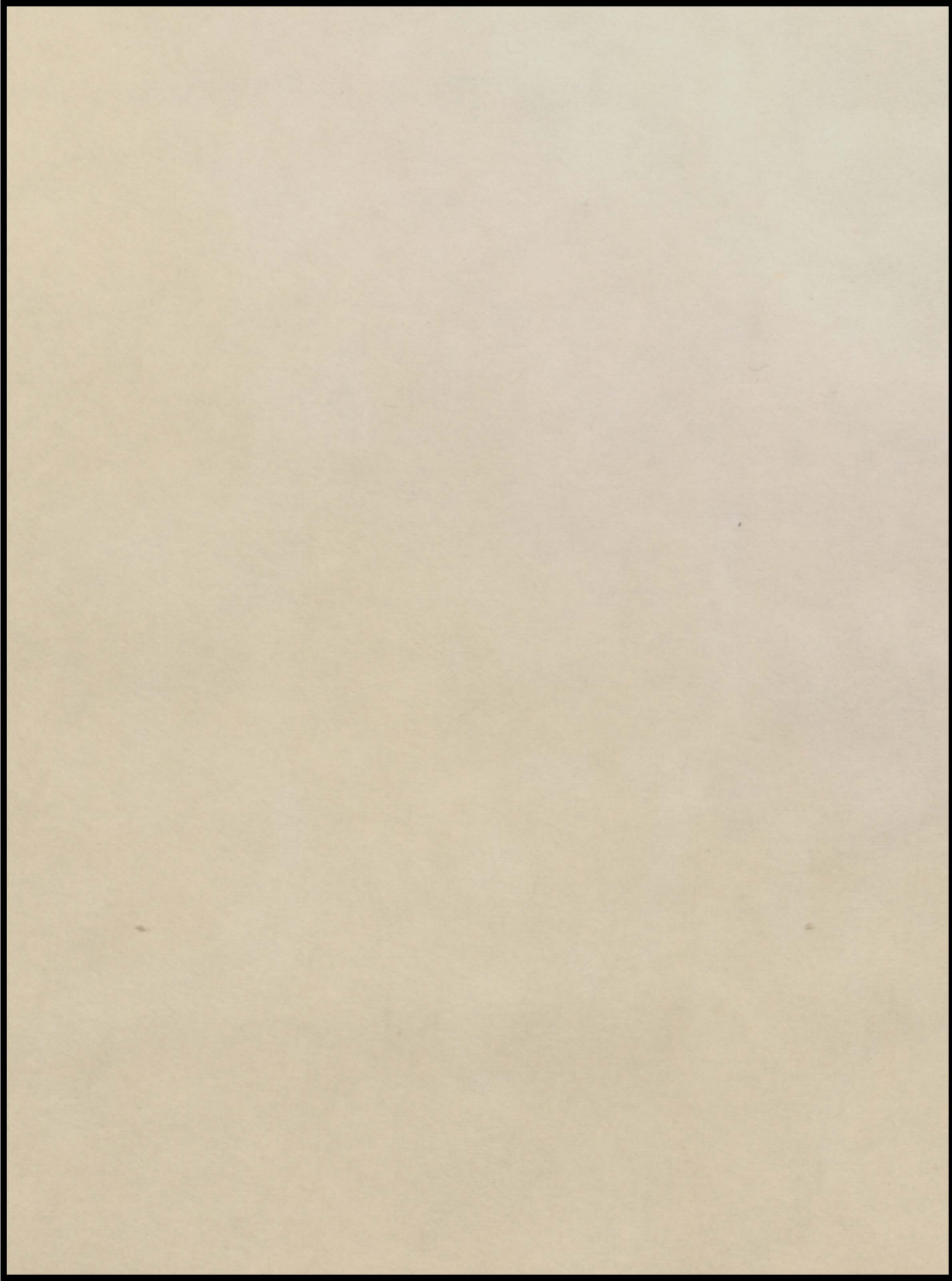


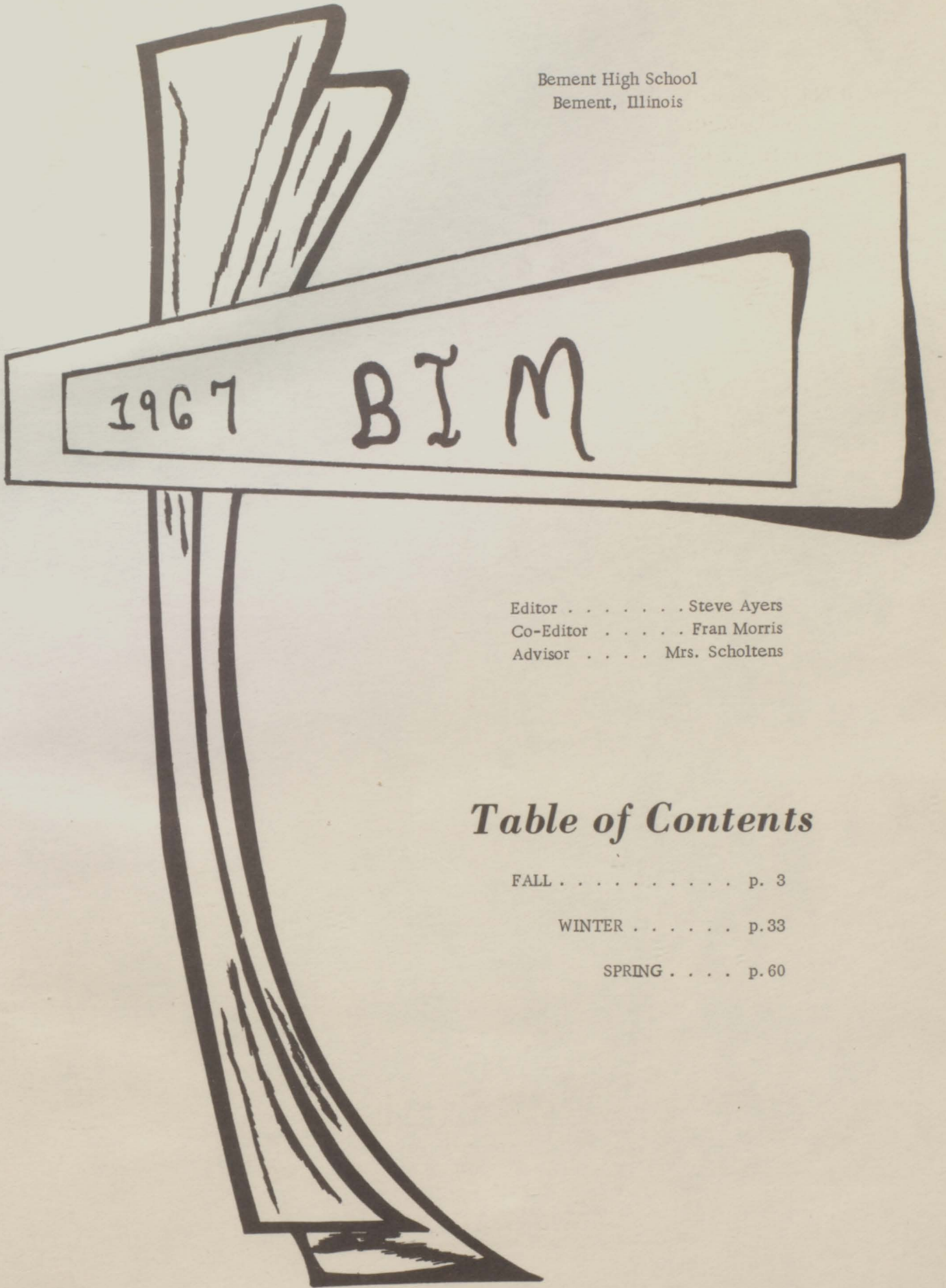

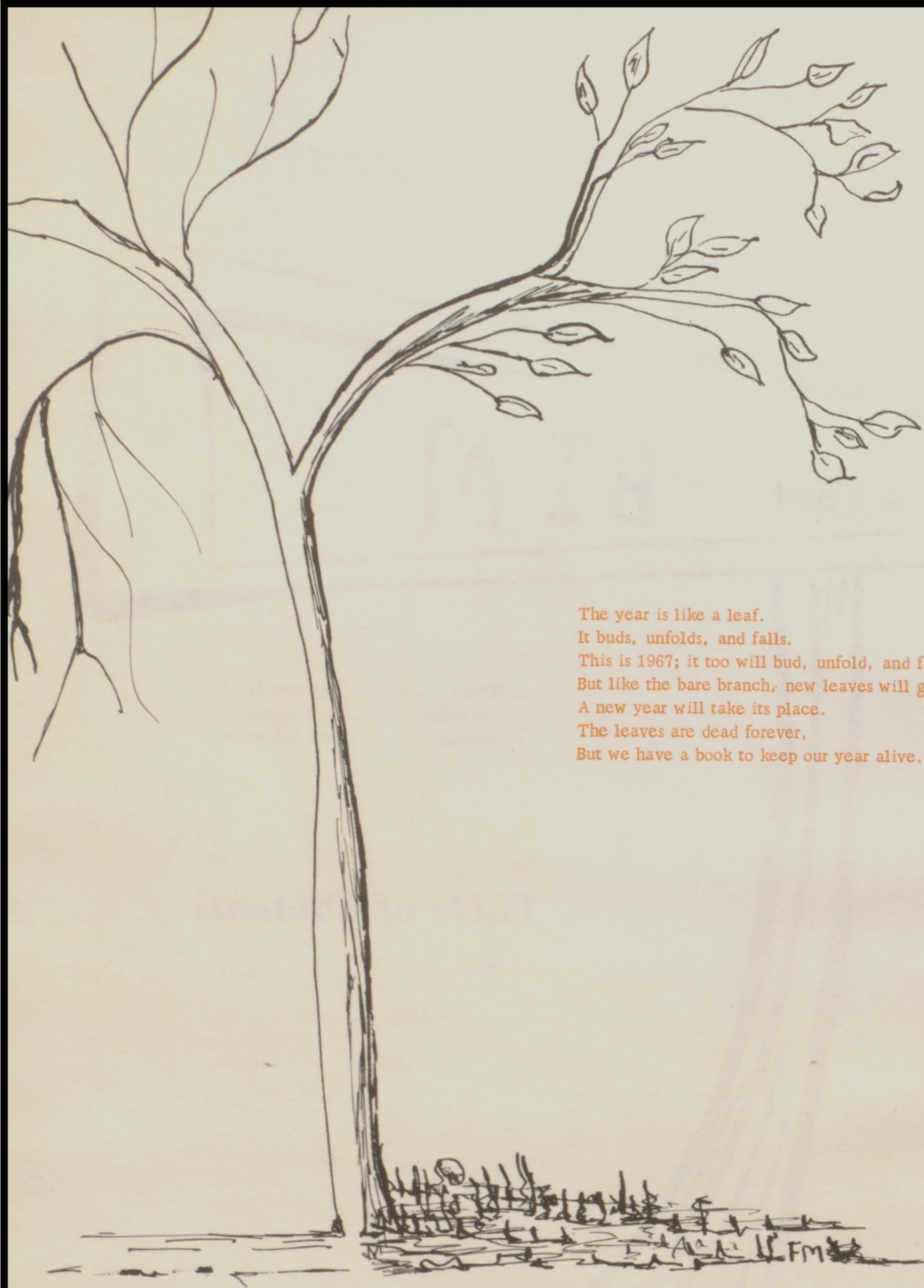

But we have a book to keep our year alive.



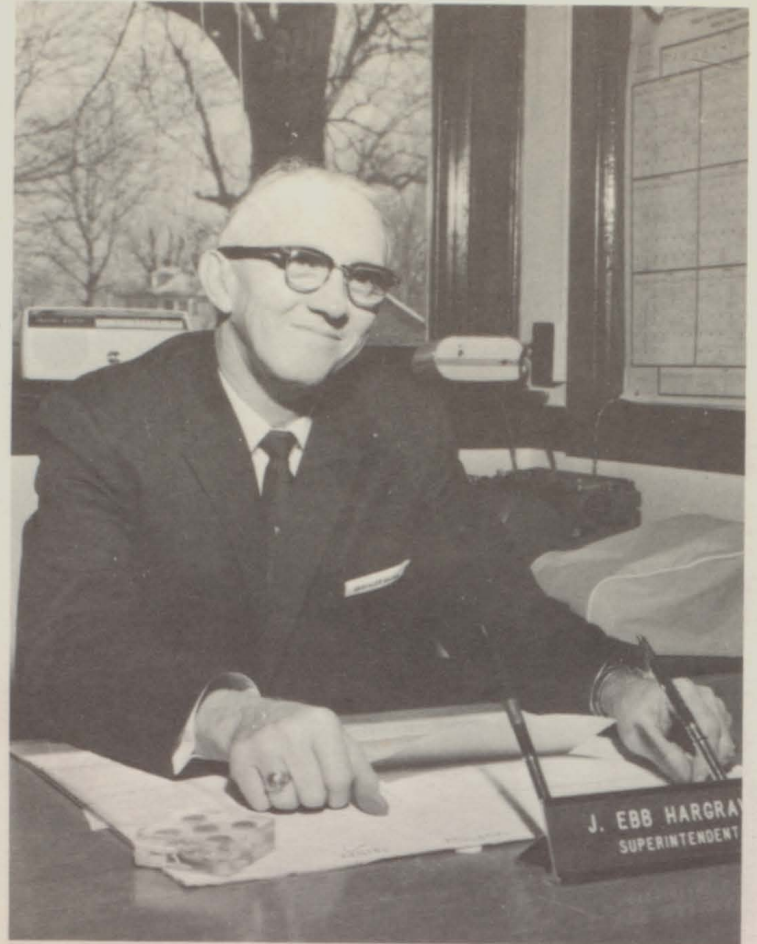

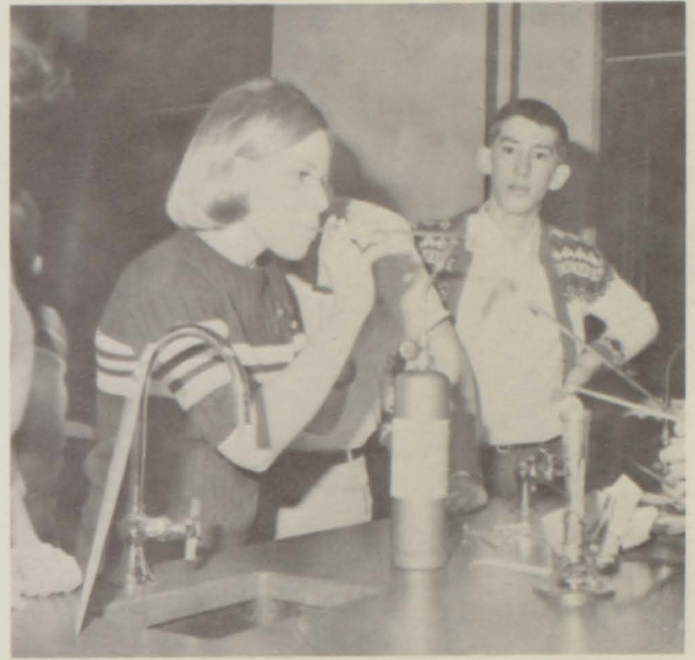
One of the most important jobs a librarian can do is to keep the books and magazines circulating efficiently. Here we see this job being performed just as it is many times each day.

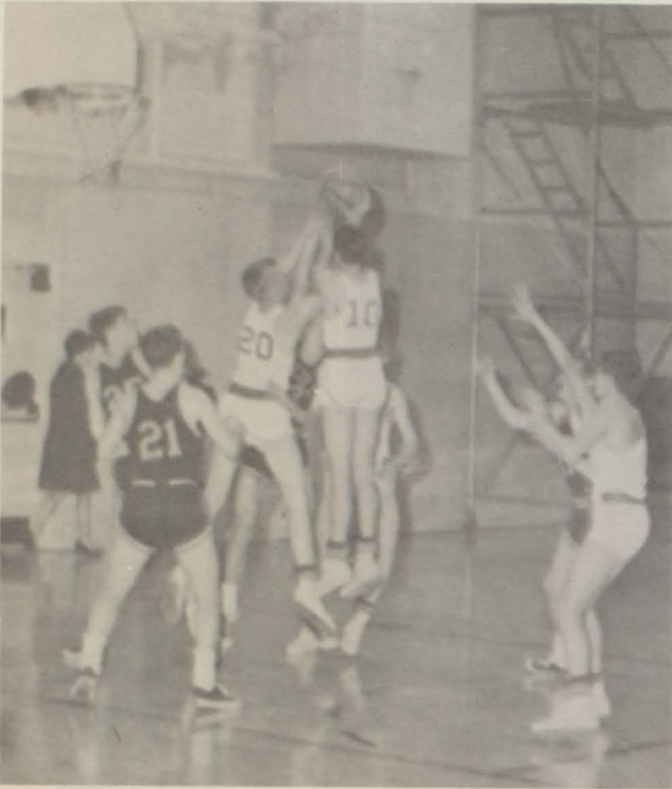
