




A Time to Lead

For twelve years, I have had the great pleasure of observing the young people of Bement grow in stature, achievement, standards of conduct, and character.


All should seek training beyond high school. Seek a profession that will give you security, pride and enjoyment for the forty years or more that you will be gainfully employed.

Remember the substitute for freedom is anarchy.








The Arion Award was presented to Mark Hudson for his outstanding contribution to the music department.
