- 3. Submit your pictures with a description (accuracy matters, so be sure you label the picture with the correct species) of each picture. These can be submitted as .jpg via email (bementpubliclibrary@gmail.com) or on a thumb drive in person.
- 4. All submissions are due by midnight, August 13 (they must have a date/time stamp by that time).
- 5. Winners will be announced by the end of business (8 pm) on Monday, August 16. You can pick up your prizes thereafter at the library.
- 6. In the event of a tie, the earliest, most accurate entries will win (so time is a factor).
- 7. You can come in and consult the charts and reference books here in the library. The staff will be glad to assist you, but will not give you answers.
