It was warned by Paul in **II Timothy 4:3-4**. People want to hear something but not what is needed, instead it is what they want.

Have you ever noticed how many of the for-example televangelist shows are on? Did you ever notice with some of these how there are thousands upon thousands of people there? Have you ever heard the sermons that have been given in these cases? Not much to them. Filled with a lot of words but have no true understanding of salvation. People are looking at how many people there are and say that is automatically successful. You know at Pentecost there are at least three thousand people there. I imagine there were more than that and as you would agree too. However, three thousand were saved that day. What was the gospel message. Peter convicted them of putting Jesus to the cross. Peter told them that he indeed was Lord and Christ of all. It was just fluff it was a message telling them they need to repent.

Peter goes on in his second epistle to talk about false doctrine. In **II Peter 2:18** he goes into detail of what false teaching is like. When you talk about fluff dessert you fill up with light airy food and usually even though you got filled your body didn't get the nutrients as in fact starving. When you fill a soul full of fluff you are offering words of emptiness. Yes, people may believe they are receiving the gospel and has led the soul to being full it is fact decaying and growing even more corrupt. *While they promise liberty, they themselves are slaves of corruption* (**II Peter 2:19**). Friends, we need to get away from the fluff. There are times when we can offer some words of comfort, but we need to get to the heart of the matter. We need to preach the truth, we need to let people know of sin, we need to let people know that sin is going to separate one from God (**Romans 6:23**). People need to know the real story of Jesus.
