We hope you find this informative and a guide based on our experience. These items are for our Isuzu NPS 75/155, items may vary depending on your vehicle

From most important to least

1. Tyre Deflator/ Pressure Gauge

Karl replaced the gauge with a quality suitable one to handle truck pressures. Unable to find one with suitable pressures. We use an ARB Deflator with the replaced gauge.

\$80 for the deflator

\$120 for the pressure gauge mod

2. Winch 25000lbs

To be able to self-recover a winch is a must, two if possible. \$3000 each

3. Shackles x2 and winch dampener

A winch dampener does not need to be purchased but you must use a suitable method to dampen the cable/rope ie a tarp Get the correct rated shackles for the application to an Australian Standard.

4. Tree Trunk protector 5t WWL

Minimum one, two required for a triple line pull \$230 each

5. Snatch block 6.5t WWL

Minimum one, two required for a triple line pull \$380 each

6. Recovery Tracks x4

\$270 per set of two (Maxx Trax)

7. Snatch Straps

Minimum one, recommend two for length Join with soft shackle/ rolled newspaper or a appropriate stick \$250 each

8. Drag Chain

Heavier the better

\$200 each

9. Soft Shackle

Bigger the better

\$100 each

10. Tyre Chains (if you don't run mud tyres)

\$1000 set of two

11. Wireless winch controller

\$200 each

In the future we hope to purchase a ground anchor such as a Deadman with a suitable rating for a truck. Till then we will have to bury the spare wheel as a recovery point.
