There is Grace. As I was reading through the scriptures for the upcoming series from the book of Romans, there were three words that stood out to me; law, sin, and self. In fact, one that really stood out to me in Romans 7:5 was "Self-centered." I was reading from a relatively new translation, so maybe I had never seen the idea expressed in quite that way before.



The purpose of this entire section of Romans is to remind people who live under the Jewish Law, that Christ has come to fulfill the law. Law was here to help make us aware of sin, which separates us from God. Grace however, is the power that makes sure that we are never completely separated from the love of God, no matter how the power of Sin tries to convince us

that we are not worthy.

The world of the 1st Century was a mess. Poverty was everywhere, the country was occupied by the Roman Army, and many of the Jewish leaders that we would expect to have a heart for the people were corrupt themselves. Into this world came the embodiment of Hope, Jesus the Christ.

He broke down barriers between people, he offered healing to many, he even offered healing to the family of Roman soldiers. He taught us how to love our neighbor, and even how to love our enemies. The main thing he offered us though, was what the apostle Paul spoke so much about in the letter to the church in Rome. He offered us reconciliation with God even after we had succumbed to the power of Sin. He offered us what we call today, salvation. All we can do is thank him for that gift. We thank him for using his grace to overcome the power of law, and Sin, and our own self-centeredness. We are in this together, and nothing will separate us, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Give thanks to God.

May God's Kingdom come, on earth as it is in heaven!

Annandale Kitchen Repairs Progress

In case you had not heard yet, the coffee maker in the kitchen allowed water to run freely in the church kitchen and into the lower level for an entire weekend. We had a flood! The clean-up phase of repairs is completed. Insurance should cover all expenses except the \$2500 deductible.

The plan moving forward is to repair the damage to the kitchen cabinets, replace the floor in the kitchen, install new matching countertops in the kitchen, and to continue to evaluate what is needed in the lower level as repairs progress.

Physically, we have not yet started on the rebuilding process, however, the behind the scenes work with the insurance company has been progressing well.

Thank you to our trustees, and to everyone who has supported us in this effort.

The silver lining to this cloud is that this flood happened while we were not using the building.
