Christ Recognizes and Loves Us

1st John 3 See what kind of love the Father has given to us in that we should be called God's children, and that is what we are! Because the world didn't recognize him, it doesn't recognize us.

²Dear friends, now we are God's children, and it hasn't yet appeared what we will be. We know that when he appears we will be like him because we'll see him as he is. ³And all who have this hope in him purify themselves even as he is pure.

In 1994 Elton John sang a song for the animated movie, *The Lion King*. The song I'm thinking of is titled, *Can You Feel the Love Tonight*. It was sung in the movie while the two lions, Simba and Nala, frolicked a bit, and their relationship grew. Today, as I read this verse from 1st John 3, this song popped into my head from out of nowhere. I think I may have related the question, can you feel the love tonight, with the phrase in the scripture about the world not recognizing Jesus, and not recognizing the people who follow Jesus.

As we move into the month of November, I'm thinking about two things. First, I'm hoping that November will be a bit warmer than October was. And second, I'm thinking how important it is for us to do our best to live out the love that God has shared with us. Christmas is coming, and I am sure it won't look the same as it has in the past. Our Candlelight Christmas Eve service won't have candles, there won't be congregational singing, there won't be the crowds that usually inspire us so completely. Yet, there will be Love. Not the passionate Hollywood kind of love, but love that comes from a lifetime commitment. A true reflection of the love that our creator has shared with us since the

beginning of time and will last until the last second runs out on the clock.

So, we hope that your celebrations of Thanksgiving and Christmas will be more meaningful to you this year than they have ever been before. They will look different, however, that doesn't mean that they are less important. In fact, sharing your love this year is probably more important than it has ever been before.

Christ recognizes us, sees, us, and loves us more than we will ever know. For that we give thanks. Because Christ first loved us, I know we will all feel the love tonight.

As John Wesley said on his death bed, "The best of all, God is with us."

May God's Kingdom come, on earth as it is in heaven!

We have many options for sharing worship together and with physical distancing.

1)- Our prerecorded video and print worship experiences are still reaching many new people. As in the past, we encourage you to take part in our online worship by going to www.vimeo.com/revwindsurfer and choosing which Sunday worship you would like to watch.

2)- In person worship in our building has reached about half of our normal attendance. This is what we expected. We have some restrictions, such as physical distancing, no singing, and now masks are required in public places. Your safety is our priority.

3)- We also offer a drive in worship experience. Simply park within a block of the church building, tune your FM radio to 88.7, and enjoy the service live. You may be able to greet people as they leave the building after worship.

4)- We also have the live service streaming on Facebook Live. Please search for the worship service on either Paul Baker's personal page, or Montrose or Annandale UMCs Facebook page. You do not need a Facebook account to watch Facebook Live. The service will also be saved on Facebook so you can watch it later if need be.

We are also offering a Monday evening online Bible Study Group via Zoom. If you are on our email list, you will receive an email invitation for that group on Sunday each week.
