If you do found one during the winter wandering around, rather call wild life authorities to assist.

When a wild hedgehog are seen during the day it is often an indication of illness. Although it is possible that humans or other animals disturbed the hedgehog in his hibernating place, but it is best to get it checked out by professionals.

These hedgehogs are protected species and should never be kept as a pet. You find find yourself a hefty fine of R5000 and more if caught with one.

Although she recovered quickly, her quills are still today a bit sparse comparing to other hedgehogs. Luckily for her, her new owner is a fast learner and no quitter. The next terrible blow was being diagnosed with cancer. Here is Norm's story. Name of owner not mentioned as for a housing sensitivity related matter.

Norm's owner is an history lover and expert, and her Gotcha Day was on 6 June 2021. History fact: 6 June 1944 was the landing of Normandy! This makes her unusual name just more special!



Norms journey:

"On the evening of 24 February 2025 we found a lump on Norm's neck that had not been there the night before. Our hearts sank as it had all the hallmarks of cancer. We WhatsApped the vet and woke up to a message the next morning saying we could bring her in at 9h30. We rushed to the vet who confirmed our fears. Norm was taken in for her operation the same day and came home on 26 February 2025.

The operation had gone well and Norm was grumpy but happy to be home. We went for weekly checkups the next two weeks and a further lump was felt. Norm went in for a further operation to remove what the vet suspected was an infected lymph node, but turned out to be necrotic tissue.

Norm came home the day after and was happy to be home but still grumpy. Norm was healing well when early one Saturday we saw what seemed to be an infection and we rushed her to Fourways vet as her normal veterinarian was already closed for the day. She received antibiotics for what we thought was an infected stitch.



We went to our own vet, Bryanston Avian & Exotics veterinary on the Sunday during their emergency hours and the vet told us that Norm was biting herself likely due to displaced nerve pain. Norm was put on Gaba and antibiotics. She is now doing well but is till on Gaba as the vet noted that once hedgehogs start biting themselves it can be a hard habit to unlearn. Norm had now healed completely with the only sign of the operation and biting being the fact that the hair where they shaved her is still not fully back. However Norm is back to her old self running in her wheel, playing and cuddling happily."

On 6 June Norm will celebrate her 4th year living happily with an amazing owner who would do anything for her spikey kids.
