Financial Peace University Graduates Class of March 2019

March 12 was graduation day for forty members of the first SRCC Financial Peace University class. The nine-week course focused on the seven Baby Steps which included such items as budgeting and starting an emergency fund, paying off all non-mortgage debt using the Debt Snowball, increasing the emergency fund to cover three to six months of expenses, investing for retirement, saving for a college fund, paying off a home early and building wealth and giving. Also covered was education about taking power over purchases, the role of insurance and the seven basic types that are needed, 401k's, IRA's and mutual fund investing, specific mortgage information and the recognition that when you live and give like no one else, you change yourself, your family tree and your community.

During the FPU course, the March 2019 class:

- paid off \$45,808 in non-mortgage debt
- saved \$52,286
- cut up and closed the accounts on 30 credit cards.
- Fifty-six percent of the class substantially increased giving.
