SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT......by Larry Whiteley isn't it amazing what one little seed can do?

Most of us are enjoying a delicious bounty of home grown tomatoes right now. Have you ever stopped to think about how amazing it is that from one little seed grows a tomato plant and from that plant many more tomatoes grow? Inside each tomato are many more seeds that can also be planted to grow many more tomatoes.

Jesus in Matthew chapter 13 tells his disciples parables about seeds. We should all be looking for opportunities to plant seeds. A seed is planted when we make a visitor to Cowboy Church feel welcome through a hand shake and a smile or invite them to set next to us instead of saving those seats for friends or family that we see all the time. A seed is planted too when we invite someone to Cowboy Church.

A seed is planted when, as a church, we reach out to people in the community who are in need of help. A seed is planted through cards, phone calls, e-mails and even text messages to those who need to know you care.

A seed is planted when we use our God given gifts to touch others. Your seed may be the gift of song, playing a musical instrument, leadership, teaching, cooking, or prayer. God didn't give you gifts to hide them but to use them to reach others for him.

A seed is planted when someone sees us act like a Christian should and wants to have what we have. A seed is planted when we boldly tell someone about Jesus.

Plant seeds and someday you will meet Jesus and he will say, "Come let me introduce you to some people." There before you is the visitor you made feel welcome, the one you invited to church, the one you helped, the one you taught. Behind them is the one you sent a card or called. To the side is the one you witnessed to and next to them is the one you didn't even know was looking.

Behind these people are many more people stretching as far as you can see. Because of the seed you planted in one person that seed grew into many other seeds that touched someone and each one of those seeds grew to touch many, many more people.

Isn't it amazing what one little seed can do?

LETTER FROM PASTOR SCOTTY

Friends and family of the SRCC

I have always tried to be completely honest with you and admit when I make wrong decisions. Part of my personality leads me to be experimental and entrepreneurial which makes me an early adapter to change. Later, after a change is made, I will, sometimes, have a moment of clarity and realize my error. I want to make a change in our Thursday night schedule. Our new Event Center is amazing and is a huge blessing to our church and community. I can't say enough about the people who gave to provide it and to the people who designed, built and use it. Originally my heart was captured by the idea of bringing the Word of God to people in a market space environment. At the Livestock Marketing Center (LMC) people who would never visit a church, much less regularly attend one, find themselves loving Jesus without all the church baggage. For all the years we have worshipped at the LMC my heart has been blessed and at peace. I feel the Lord's presence and sense his blessing on us every service. I believe the Lord called me to pastor the SRCC primarily at the LMC. I plan to never leave it until the Lord puts me on the shelf or hands me my robe for the heavenly choir.

About three months ago we experimented with moving our Thursday night service to the Event Center (EC). The rationale was to move into more comfortable environs and the EC met that need in spades. The change has accomplished much of what we hoped for and even increased our comfort and attendance. What I did not expect was finding my heart longing for and being led to return to the LMC.

Now - how do we fix this problem? The service at the EC is loved by so many. The EC is temperature controlled, it has amazing sound equipment, the kitchen is so handy and the air has a more pleasant smell etc. It is absolutely great worship space. Here is a solution I have come up with. Allow me to offer two Thursday night services - one at the LMC and one at the EC. We could offer a 6 PM service at the LMC and a 7 PM service at the EC. I will offer my services to be the lead teacher in both services. I expect the 6 PM service at the LMC to be shorter, smaller and focus more on teaching, prayer and fellowship and less on the music worship. This means our wonderful music program will stay the same at the EC.

When do we begin with the new 6 PM service on Thursday?

For many years I have taken a late summer vacation the week or so following our Sac River Creek baptism. I want to lead us to start the 6 PM service at the LMC when I come back to service in mid September. I realize this change both solves and creates problems. Leadership is not a science and our humanity doesn't always find God's direction perfectly. Thank you for your understanding and for loving me enough to trust me with this change.
