Most of you have a good father to celebrate with this Father's Day. Others of you will remember your father and the great man he was on this day. Then there are those of you who didn't have what a father should be. I am one of those.

I have no memories of playing catch or shooting baskets. I have no memories of fishing trips or vacations. I have no memories of sitting on his lap or of him ever telling me he loved me. He never went to church with us and never opened a bible.

His father was like that too and that's how he grew up so he didn't know how to be a father. When I became a father I promised myself I would not be like my dad but I still messed up at times. I did things I am not proud of. It took me a while to get rid of my father in me.

Even with my mistakes, thanks to their Godly mother, our boys have grown into Godly men that I am very proud of. They have mostly good memories and they know that I love them. Their children have no doubts that their father loves them. They work hard at being good fathers. I thank God for that.

Fathering a child is not difficult. But *being* a father is! The first and most important decision of fathers is to make a conscientious choice to be a father.

I have always tried to be completely honest with you and admit when I make wrong decisions. Part of my personality leads me to be experimental and entrepreneurial which makes me an early adapter to change. Later, after a change is made, I will, sometimes, have a moment of clarity and realize my error. I want to make a change in our Thursday night schedule. Our new Event Center is amazing and is a huge blessing to our church and community. I can't say enough about the people who gave to provide it and to the people who designed, built and use it. Originally my heart was captured by the idea of bringing the Word of God to people in a market space environment. At the Livestock Marketing Center (LMC) people who would never visit a church, much less regularly attend one, find themselves loving Jesus without all the church baggage. For all the years we have worshipped at the LMC my heart has been blessed and at peace. I feel the Lord's presence and sense his blessing on us every service. I believe the Lord called me to pastor the SRCC primarily at the LMC. I plan to never leave it until the Lord puts me on the shelf or hands me my robe for the heavenly choir.

About three months ago we experimented with moving our Thursday night service to the Event Center (EC). The rationale was to move into more comfortable environs and the EC met that need in spades. The change has accomplished much of what we hoped for and even increased our comfort and attendance. What I did not expect was finding my heart longing for and being led to return to the LMC.

Now - how do we fix this problem? The service at the EC is loved by so many. The EC is temperature controlled, it has amazing sound equipment, the kitchen is so handy and the air has a more pleasant smell etc. It is absolutely great worship space. Here is a solution I have come up with. Allow me to offer two Thursday night services - one at the LMC and one at the EC. We could offer a 6 PM service at the LMC and a 7 PM service at the EC. I will offer my services to be the lead teacher in both services. I expect the 6 PM service at the LMC to be shorter, smaller and focus more on teaching, prayer and fellowship and less on the music worship. This means our wonderful music program will stay the same at the EC.

When do we begin with the new 6 PM service on Thursday?

For many years I have taken a late summer vacation the week or so following our Sac River Creek baptism. I want to lead us to start the 6 PM service at the LMC when I come back to service in mid September. I realize this change both solves and creates problems. Leadership is not a science and our humanity doesn't always find God's direction perfectly. Thank you for your understanding and for loving me enough to trust me with this change.

SRCC Teaching Young People To Serve

If you ask a typical young person what their FAVORITE activity is , it's highly unlikely that you will hear WORKING mentioned, but the youth at SRCC do enjoy work days. It's a time of fellowship for them and they are learning to help others. Servitude is something we want our young people to not only learn about, but be a part of as well.

April 13th was a work day at the Campgrounds in Ash Grove. Our young people worked hard to rake and burn leaves, remove trash and prepare the campgrounds for the summer programs. Perhaps the biggest excitement came when our young ladies turned over an old wooden box and were greeted by a very unhappy opossum! I've never seen them move so fast and I'm pretty sure their screams could be heard in the next county! It was a time of fellowship they will never forget.
