


TRIBUTE TO DENNY GOLD BY MARY GREENE

The first time SRCC met Denny Gold was at Scotty's invitation on a cold winter's night in 2006 in the old Springfield sale barn on Division just off Kansas. Three families, soon joined by a fourth, had been meeting on Thursday nights all through the summer in a horse barn on BB Highway with the intention of starting a



"cowboy church." We happened to be in the right place, after cold weather came, to meet Scotty Killingsworth who felt a calling to be our pastor. Scotty declared that he knew someone that just must





heaters so loud we could hardly hear, and did a cowboy poem, the first some of us had ever heard. And we liked it, and we liked him, and that was his first of many niches. A few weeks later we had an organizational meeting at



Scotty's house, and as needs would be raised, Denny would volunteer his wife who was not present. He would say, "My wife can do that," or "Sandy's really good at that." We came away amused knowing that he thought highly of his wife's skills but not sure she would be as thrilled to do all this as he was to volunteer her.

We were given a week's notice to vacate the old sale barn that had


been sold and was being torn down. So we sent Scotty to ask Tom Kissee for permission to have services in the newer livestock auction building on the interstate. Soon after that, it was time to incorporate as a non-profit, and Denny was listed, and probably still is, as a director, another niche.

Denny began to teach himself to play the violin, and many times "the band" was Denny, the keyboard and a guy who played the bass violin in a rather unique style not appreciated by everyone. At every service, Denny would tell stories about dogs, frogs, bike-riding deer or some such nonsense in his welcoming monologue. And, didn't we all love it when he sang "This Old House" or "Who's That Knocking at my Door" or "It's Me Again, Lord"?










Denny saw a need for a songbook, so he put one together that we still use today. And when others volunteered to join the band, he picked the songs and kept the band informed and working together. Many, many nights he and Sandy had a temperamental group of musicians from diverse genres at their home practicing and enjoying great times of fellowship.





Denny was

ordained as a minister, particularly a "circuit-ridin' preacher," in September, 2008, in a blessed service surrounded by the entire church. He served as backup for Scotty and the Finley River Cowboy Church when called upon as well as officiating in a ministerial capacity when needed.



And when we could not take any more of the Livestock Market's time or space and we had to build something of our own, guess who happened to be an engineer and

had built several homes/structures? Of course, Denny stepped up, devoting major time and expertise to this massive Event Center project

that you see today.

So Scotty was right, he was the perfect addition to our team. I don't know what we would have done

without him, and I don't know how we'll do without him. But I am so glad we had him.




