Volunteers Needed

We are all so blessed to be part of Sac River Cowboy Church and to witness the growth our church has had over the past few years. We especially love seeing young families bring their children to church. And we love being able to offer a Children's Ministry designed especially for young children to learn and understand the Bible. However, in order to keep this ministry alive, we need volunteers!

On Sunday, September 19, it was announced that Melissa is stepping down from her role in the Children's ministry. Melissa has been so gracious with her time and compassion for the children to keep the ministry going, and her presence will be missed tremendously. Her last Sunday will be on October 3, 2021, so when you see her, please thank her for all she has done for the SRCC children.

If you are considering helping out, please know that there is no reason to feel insecure about volunteering with the children's ministry. The lessons and activities will be prepared in advance, so all you will need to do is show up and get ready to be blessed by these amazing kids. For the safety of our children, it is extremely important that we have a minimum of two teachers at each service. If not, then classes for that service will be cancelled.

Here are the ministry needs:

1st Service (8:30 to 9:30) We're looking for a couple more volunteers to help once a month

2nd Service (10 to 11) We need four to six volunteers to help once a month or more.

Note: This service being moved up by 30 minutes will enable people to either stay after first service or go over to the event center to help with 3rd service.

3rd Service (11:30 to 12:30) In order for this class to even happen, we must have 3 to 4 more volunteers to help once a month, or ideally a full-time teacher that would have a helper every week.

We could also use help with checking kids in and out or help cleaning up after each class.

If you feel the Holy Spirit leading you to help feed our children, then please contact **Tami Greene @ 417-861-8922**. You will need to fill out an authorization for a background check, and be given a copy of our guidelines, and let me know where you are able to help. I would also like to urge parents of children attending Children's church to fill out a background check to have on file in the event you can help out on occasions where we are shorthanded.
