#### A GREAT PLACE TO TALK TO GOD

For many years at our cabin near the Mark Twain National Forest, October was stump sitting time for me. It was just an old stump where someone had cut down a tree long ago. It was like an old friend waiting at the end of the trail.

From that stump, I could see a thin haze over the valley below. The smell of smoke was in the air from chimneys. Crows caw to each other on a distant ridge, and squirrels scurry through the treetops.

In the valley below, turkeys fly down from their roost and feed in the fields. A doe and her yearling join them. A buck watches them from his hiding place. A kingfisher squawks as he flies through the mist over the creek. It fusses at a heron fishing for breakfast or a busy beaver.

The sun rises high, and the show begins. The gray of the morning would suddenly change to a kaleidoscope of colors. My eyes would feast upon the bronze of the oaks, yellow of the maples, red of the dogwoods, and green of the cedars and pines. The blue of the sky and white of the fluffy fall clouds add a special touch to God's creation.

Stump sitting was an escape from the broken world we live. Good stump sitting time comes only in October. It helps you forget about any work that is waiting and other worries. They are all washed away by the cleansing action of stump sitting.

You don't have to sit on a tree stump. It can be sitting on your porch, working in the fields or yard, or sitting around a campfire. It could be in a tree waiting for a deer to come by or on a lake reeling in a fish. You might feel closer to God outdoors in His creation than ever. It is a great place to talk to Him, and He is listening.

# AN ANNOUNCEMENT FROM SCOTTY

Sac River Folks,

I am so thankful for the gift God gave me in Gail. She was the best thing that ever happened to me in this life. I loved her. I still love her, and I always will. Several times she and I discussed the fact that one of us would probably precede the other in death. We discussed what we want for the remaining one to do with their lives. We agreed the one left should be open to a new relationship if God sent one. We encouraged whomever remained to seek to live the fullest life possible.

As I dealt with Gail's life ending disease the role of care giver fell to me. I did all I could to make her declining life experience as good as possible. We promised to love in sickness and health til death parted us. I kept my word. The load was heavy and I struggled beneath the weight. My two girls and their husbands, and especially my son Jake, stepped in and played vital roles. On top of this crew God sent Gail's first cousin from El Paso Texas to help out. She came into our home and lightened our load by joining the care giving team. This cousin, - more like a sister to Gail - made a real difference.

After Gail passed she returned to El Paso. I was in complete confusion and suffering the full throws of grief. I hardly noticed her absence. Time passed and I began to miss her. I remembered how much she had helped and I reached out to her in a text message to thank her and to tell her how much she had meant to me. Neither of us were looking for a connection in each other more than the existent family tie. Both of us loved Gail and never thought about a relationship between us.

Later, when things began to sort themselves out I sent her another text. I asked if she thought there was any possibility of a deeper relationship between us. She immediately said, "No", and I dropped the query and went on with my life thinking the idea of us together was a dead end. A little later she texted back saying, "She wanted nothing but what God had for her." To summarize her feelings at that time she was quite "shocked" at the idea.

As the days went by she began to pray and seek the Lord. Her heart began to warm to the idea and to me. We prayed, talked and eventually realized God was behind the scenes working in all things for good. Diana Seely Brown is Gail's cousin who came and helped us so much. She was a single lady divorced for the past 15 years from a husband who walked out of her life into the arms of another woman. She successfully raised her daughter and finished her education and became a paralegal working for lawyers and many Judges in the Springfield area. She moved to Oklahoma where she worked for oil companies with a focus on legal issues. She now resides in El Paso, Texas to be near her daughter, her daughter's husband and grandchildren. She was organist for her church where her son-in-law is music minister and associate pastor in a very large and growing independent Baptist church.

Time has gone by and we have come to the place where we want to unite our lives in marriage. I ask you, Sac River Cowboy people, to welcome Diana Sue Killingsworth as God's gift to me and to the church. As you loved Gail, I have no doubt you will her. This decision may seem to have been made a little quickly for some, but I believe God is leading and has given His blessing. We now ask for yours.


