The SRCC Board of Directors Announces a New Safe Worship Service

I miss those of you who have opted to stay away from crowds of people because of the COVID-19 pandemic. I completely understand the necessity to deal carefully with health issues or compromised immune systems. I have heard from some that isolation is becoming a growing ache in your heart. I'm told you are really missing being together in worship. Virtual church on the internet is good, but you desire more. What if we could create a new "Safe Worship Service"? I am convinced if we were to offer a worship service where you would feel somewhat confident in avoiding the virus some of you might be blessed in a guarded return to church. Here is what Don Wood planted in my mind just last Saturday. He said in essence, why don't we offer a safe cowboy worship service that excludes the traditional coffee and doughnuts and requires everyone attending to wear a mask? What if this worship experience did not include singing or handshaking? In this safe service, we could socially distance ourselves and lower the potential for infection. I must apologize for not thinking of this already. I am so glad for Don Wood's idea and others like him who have a warm heart for all our church people attending in person or sheltering at home. Because the need for safe contact in a worship and fellowship setting has been marinating for several months I don't think we need to delay launching this new service very long. So if you feel this kind of service will meet your spiritual needs and at the same time provide a somewhat safe environment, join me (Scotty) on Saturday morning September 5 at 8:30 a.m. in the Event Center. Here is the format for the Safe Service - We will gather with face masks required and sit socially distanced from each other. We will have a time of prayer followed by a sermon. After the teaching/preaching time we will close with prayer and exit with as much or little social interaction as you want. Starting something like this is easier than ending it. Are we starting something that has the potential for a long life? Or is this just a patch on a problem that may be only a temporary fix? I don't know. It could be either. I say let us start it and just see what happens. If it meets needs and enough people opt in to give the experience the energy it needs to survive, who knows where it might go in the future?

SHALL WE GATHER AT THE RIVER

Yes, we'll gather at the river, The beautiful, the beautiful river; Gather with the saints at the river That flows by the throne of God.

We'll be gathering at a creek instead of a river but Sunday, September 13th will be a very special day and especially for those who have made the commitment to be baptized at our annual "Baptism at the Creek". It is a significant next step in the journey of following Jesus.

Jesus himself was baptized. He was not a sinner, yet he humbled himself in obedience to identify with us and give us an example to follow. Mark 1:9-11 NIV says, "At that time Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. Just as Jesus was coming up out of the water, he saw heaven being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."

Before being baptized you need to believe in the Lord Jesus Christ and that he died on that cross for your sins, you need to confess your sins to God and accept Jesus as your Lord and Savior. Baptism is a public confession of faith in and commitment to Jesus Christ. It is a symbol of Christ's burial and resurrection. The entrance into the water during baptism identifies with Christ's death on the cross, His burial in the tomb and His resurrection from the dead. Baptism is meant to show that you love, trust and have put your hope in Christ. Baptism does not "save" you, only your faith in Christ does that.

Many have already added their name and phone number to the baptism sheets on all our tables at the Livestock Center and the Event Center. This information is needed in order to have baptismal certificates ready for that day. But, if you don't decide to be baptized until that day don't let that stop you. We will be waiting in the water with open arms and God will be smiling down as we gather at the creek.
