#### SOMETHING TO THINK ABOOT.....by Larry Whiteley an important step

Jesus himself was baptized. He was not a sinner, yet he humbled himself in obedience to identify with us and give us an example to follow. Mark 1: 9-11 says, "At that time Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. Just as Jesus was coming up out of the water, he saw heaven being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. And a voice came from heaven saying, "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."

Sunday, September 12th is our annual "Baptism at the River". Before being baptized you need to believe in the Lord Jesus Christ and that he died on the cross for your sins. You need to confess your sins to God and accept Jesus as your Lord and Savior. Baptism is a public confession of faith in and commitment to Jesus Christ. It is a symbol of Jesus burial and resurrection. The entrance into the water during baptism symbolizes Jesus death on the cross, His burial in the tomb and His resurrection from the dead. Baptism is meant to show that you love, trust and have put your hope in Jesus. Baptism does not "save" you, only your faith in Jesus does that.

Many have added their name to the sign-up sheets at the Livestock Center and our Event Center. This information is needed in order to have baptismal certificates ready for that day. You still have time to add your name to the list. But, if you don't decide to be baptized until that very day or even that very hour, please don't let that stop you from being baptized in the river.

When you are standing on that river bank and step forward into the water, it is an important step in your Christian life. God will be well pleased.

# Message from Scotty

The Next Chapter

The first chapter of the SRCC was hopeful, beautiful and intimate. A few loving, visionary people met in homes, barns and the musty, dusty old Stockyards in Springfield MO. They dreamed of using cowboy culture to reach an under reached demographic with the Gospel of Jesus. Chapter one was hopeful, beautiful and intimate. It was full of promise.

Chapter two began as the SRCC moved into the beautiful, clean and upscale Springfield Livestock Marketing Center. What was hopeful, intimate and beautifully born suddenly became filled with the very people the founding men and women dreamed it would be. It grew faster than everyone imagined. One service on Sunday morning became filled so a second was added. Next came a third service needed to provide worship space for the burgeoning growth.
