Sunday, September 8th, is a special day at Sac River Cowboy Church. We will gather again at the Sac River for our annual Baptism at the River after our 10 am services at both our Livestock Center and our Event Center. A map of how to get there is in this newsletter. There will be no 11:30 service at the Event Center.

You still have time to put your name on the baptismal sheets on the tables. That way, we know how many Bibles and baptismal certificates to have at the creek. If you do not decide until that day, don't let that stop you. It is never too late to make that decision.

Before being baptized, believe in the Lord Jesus Christ and His death on the cross for your sins. Confess your sins to God and accept Jesus as your Lord and Savior. That is between you and God, but Scotty, Mark, Ron, Don, or I will also talk to you if you have questions.

Baptism is a public confession of faith and commitment to Jesus. It is a symbol of His burial and resurrection. Baptism shows that you love, trust, and have put your hope in Christ. Baptism does not save you. Only your faith in Christ does that.

Kids, adults, senior citizens, brothers and sisters, husbands, and wives will be lined up on the gravel bar that day as they wait their turn. Some will hold on to each other while being baptized. For those of us who will be helping to baptize, it is a blessing to watch folks coming toward us into the water and see their faces as they come up out of that water. I encourage you to attend the baptism service and support those taking this step in their Christian life

After the baptismal service, we will return to our Event Center for great food and fellowship. The church will provide pulled pork, ham and beans, cornbread, and grilled brats. You need to bring side dishes or desserts. Please join us at the river for this important day in the lives of those baptized.

REAL ESTATE PROPERTY TAX FREEZE FOR SENIORS IN MISSOURI:

As many of you may have heard, the MO Senate Bill 190 was passed allowing several counties and municipalities across Missouri to implement a property tax freeze for Missouri Senior Citizens. It would freeze their homeowner's property taxes at the rate of the year they first become eligible (upon reaching the age of 62), preventing them from rising if the value of their house changes or if tax entities, like a school district or fire district, raise the property tax rate. This bill was changed somewhat by Bill 756 to clarify eligibility. Bill 756 allows this freeze to include persons that are retired from railroad retirement, police and other public service pensions, teachers, etc.

Under the new bill, you can be eligible for the tax freeze if:

- You are 62 or older
- Live in a county or municipality that has enacted the freeze
- Live in the house you are applying for as your primary residence

Instead of receiving money back in a tax credit, future property tax bill will take off any new tax beyond the "frozen" portion of the bill, preventing eligible seniors from having to pay more.

It will be administered by the county and may vary from county to county.

<u>Christian County:</u> Application deadlines for a 2024 tax freeze has already expired (June 30). Check with them to see about 2025.

Greene County: An application available online or in Greene County's Clerk's Office must be filed at 940 N Boonville, Room 113, Springfield, by **September 30.** The application will need to notarized.

In order to apply for Greene County, copies of the following documents are required to be attached: Proof of identity: birth certificate, driver license or state/federal photo ID;

Proof of ownership: deed identifying you as the owner of the property or a written instrument showing you have a legal or equitable interest in the property. Need help, contact the Greene County Recorder of Deeds. Proof of liability for payment of taxes: copy of the most recent full year paid property tax receipt for the parcel. Available on Greene County's Collector's website by name or address.

Lawrence County: Nothing has been put in place for 2024. Please check with them for 2025.

Polk County: They are still in the process of determining the legal aspects of this freeze. One of the commissioners from Polk County was understanding that your assessment will freeze, but if a tax levy increases or decreases your taxes may change. Nothing has yet been decided for 2024. You will need to check with them for 2025.

WELCOME THE NEW EDITOR OF THE BUNKHOUSE GAZETTE


