Gardening Tips for June 2025 By Linda Simmons

Spring is leaving us and summer is fast approaching. Some of the best blooming bushes are in the Spring: The lilacs, Mock Oranges, Forsythias, and spring blooming trees like the Redbuds, and Dogwoods. I should mention all the spring flowers like tulips, daffodils, and the Iris.

I want to talk about the Iris today. Since the early and mid-blooming Iris are about done and the later blooming varieties are finishing up right now. As soon as the Iris quit blooming you need to deal will them if they are overgrown or you have not fertilized them in 2 years. It is best to do this before it gets too hot as this gives them the best advantage. Also if you have more types of flowers in your flower bed this will help those flowers to not have to compete with the leaves from the Iris.

The first thing is to reduce the size of the height of your iris leaves and completely remove any yellowing or dead leaves. After you do that take a pair of scissors and cut the leaves of your Iris into a fan shape at about 6 inches on the outside leaves to 8 inches tall of the middle leaf. If you are leaving your clump of Iris in the ground then you need to dig around them and then mix equal parts of your soil with Peat moss and intersperse pelleted phosphate in after you have mixed the peat moss with your soil. After you have put your soil amendments around your clump then proceed to the next clump of Iris. You can also use the pelleted 3 month extended fertilizer as another boost to your Iris. Another thing that needs to be done at this time of year is before your Tall Garden Phlox starts to bloom and it is a big clump then do what the English Gardners do to their Tall Garden Phlox. Visually divide your clump into thirds from back to front. Leave the back third of it alone and let it bloom at its regular time. The middle part of the clump you clip to 24 inches high and the front third part you clip it to 18 inches high.

The English Gardners have done this for many years to extend the blooming season of those Tall Garden Phlox. DO NOT attempt this if your Phlox has already has flowers buds on it...wait until the next year to try this trick on your Phlox.
