IT IS AMAZING WHAT ONE LITTLE SEED CAN DO

Some of us are starting to enjoy a delicious bounty of homegrown tomatoes right now. Have you ever stopped to think about how amazing it is that from one seed grows a tomato plant? From that plant, many more tomatoes grow. Inside each of those tomatoes are many seeds that will grow many more delicious tomatoes.

Jesus, in Matthew chapter 13, tells his disciples parables about seeds. We should all be looking for opportunities to plant seeds. You plant a seed when you make a visitor to church feel welcome through a handshake and smile. Or invite them to sit next to you instead of saving those seats for friends or family. You are planting a seed when you ask someone to church.

You plant another seed when you reach out to people in the community who need help through fundraisers and giving. A seed is planted through cards, phone calls, emails, texts, and Facebook messages to those who need to know you care.

A seed is planted when we use our God-given gifts to touch others. Your seed may be the gift of song, playing a musical instrument, leadership, teaching kids, cooking, protecting us, or prayer. God didn't give you gifts to hide them. He gave them to you to use in helping reach others for him.

When you act like a Christian should, instead of judging, griping, or complaining, you plant a seed. They want to have what you have. You also plant a seed when you boldly tell someone about Jesus.

Do everything you can to plant seeds. Someday, you will meet Jesus. He will say, "Come let me introduce you to some people." Standing before you will be the visitor you made feel welcome, the one you invited to church, the one you helped, the one you taught. Behind them is the one you sent a card or called. To the side, will be the one you witnessed to. Next to them is the one you didn't even know was watching you.

Behind these people could be many more people stretching as far as you can see. Because of the seed you planted in one person, that seed grew into many other seeds that touched someone. Each one of those seeds grew to touch many, many more people.

It is amazing what one little seed can do.

Meet The Folks



I'm still getting my feet under me. A fundraiser was hosted that I was able to attend upon my return to Springfield, before that I was in a rehab facility, Madonna, in Nebraska. It was such a welcoming return, in my still slightly dazed state, it has become one of my most loved memories. One of my happiest places to be is here, at Sac River Cowboy Church. Here, I have found a thriving true community under the faith of our lord and Jesus.

That means the world to me! I've recently published a poetry book, Revolutionary Poems, through Amazon. I'm hoping to take its market much further. It is primarily composed for young adults and those in teenhood, but is fully filled with many of my most thoughtful ideas, so I would hope it would be a good read for anyone. Why I specifically aim at young adults and teenagers is that this book, all the poems, were composed in my high school years. They are thoughts over the trials a teenager faces so I figure teenagers are my targeted audience. Two of the primary trials I faced in teenhood was the

angsty and depressed population and loneliness, an inability to connect, hence the name Revolutionary Poems, the moment I was finally able to get all my words out there. The moment I was able to break the barrier of hesitation. In my lonely, rather than anger, frustration, or isolation, I found love. I wanted to connect with people and I was unable to, but I found I wanted to connect because I loved those around me. My main problem in connection was that I was always waiting to hear what anyone else had to say, I hesitated and listened. There wasn't any room for me against my hesitation and patience. It wasn't the people that were against me, no one meant harm, it was my own inability to find balance, listening and being 'there'. I hope that my book can offer a different perspective, and not one of anger, though I do have a couple of angrier poems; I hope it can keep people from turning to anger and I hope it can be a companion.

Cardening Tips for July 2025

My Name is Harold Fox, while i don't consider myself a Hibiscus expert, I have had some success growing them. Hardy Hibiscus are perennials that you can grow from seeds, or they can be dug up from a small clump from established plants, whose green shoots are typically showing up in late May or early June. Many of the well-established plants have seedlings near the main plant, from seeds dropped from the year before, plant them in pots or in the ground. In the ground, should be after last frost, in soil somewhat moist but well drained. I find they grow well in most soils. In Fact, one of my major attractions to them is their low maintenance. Many of the local plant dealers sell Hardy Hibiscus. Another attraction for me are the beautiful flowers that range from saucer size to dinner plate size and bloom from about mid-lune to sometimes September. Colors ranging from deep red to whit. I have about 20 plants on my property. Seeds may be harvested in the fall, simply place a pie tin under the seed pods, a gentle shaking will yield more seeds than you will need. I find scoring the seeds with a nail file can help germination, planting them in pots indoors in early spring. Plant outside when temperature warms and plants are several inches tall. My favorite method of propagation is digging a clump from established plants or digging up seedlings that come up under or near established plants. These are Hardy Hibiscus not to be confused with Tropical Hibiscus. Hardy's will die over winter and come back from year to year. They are very forgiving. Best wishes and God Bless.
