PROBABILITIES AS A FUNCTION OF FREQUENCY

As a function of frequency of occurrence, the following parameters are set:

The data used systematically to identify flooding and flash-flooding events derives from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) and its National Centers for Environmental Information's (NCEI) Storm Events database that receives its data from the National Weather Service (NWS)

See the Storm Events Database details (<https://www.ncdc.noaa.gov/stormevents/details.jsp>): With the exception of tornadoes and "severe storms" (i.e., tornadoes, "thunderstorm wind," and/or hail), all event types from NWS Directive 10-1605 (that includes flooding and flash-flooding) are recorded from January 1, 1996 to present. At the time of this writing, "present" refers to August 30, 2022.

Consequently, the timeline used to discuss the probability of flooding and flash-flooding as a function of frequency (i.e., the denominator) will be:

- 26 Years and 8 Months,
- 320 Months, or
- 9,738 Days.

Regarding the numerator, it should be noted that flooding and flash-flooding events that occur on the same day are not counted twice. However, flooding and flash-flooding events occurring on the same day but in an incorporated city within the county are counted twice, i.e., once for the unincorporated county and once for each incorporated city. Flooding events are not separated from flash-flooding events.

Following is a table summarizing the number of flooding/flash-flooding events for each of the jurisdictions comprising the Big Sandy Area Development District:

APPENDIX E: **“SEVERE WINTER STORM” EVENT DETAIL BY COUNTY/ZONE**

All data derives from the National Centers for Environmental Information (NCEI) and its Storm Events database.

Definitions for the variables comprising the definition of “severe winter storm” derive from the National Weather Service (NWS).

TYPES:

For this multi-jurisdictional, multi-hazard mitigation plan, a “severe winter storm” is defined through four (4) variables collected by the National Weather Service and published on the National Centers for Environmental Information (NCEI) Storm Events Database. They are: Blizzard, Heavy Snow, Ice Storm, and Winter Storm.

The National Weather Service defines Blizzard, Heavy Snow, Ice Storm, and Winter Storm as:

Blizzard³⁸

A “Blizzard” means that the following conditions are expected to prevail for a period of three (3) hours or longer:

- Sustained wind or frequent gusts to 35 miles per hour or greater and
- Considerable falling and/or blowing snow (i.e., reducing visibility frequently to less than a quarter (1/4) mile).

Heavy Snow³⁹

“Heavy Snow” generally means:

- Snowfall accumulating to four (4) inches or more in depth in 12 hours or less or
- Snowfall accumulating to six (6) inches or more in depth in 24 hours or less.

In forecasts, snowfall amounts are expressed as a range of values, e.g., “eight (8) to 12 inches.” However, in “heavy snow” situations where there is considerable uncertainty concerning the range of values, more appropriate phrases are used, such as “...up to 12 inches...” or “eight (8) inches or more...”

Ice Storm⁴⁰

An “Ice Storm” is used to describe occasions when damaging accumulations of ice are expected during freezing rain situations. Significant accumulations of ice pull down trees and utility lines resulting in loss of power and communication. These accumulations of ice make walking and driving extremely dangerous. Significant ice accumulations are usually accumulations of a quarter-inch (1/4”) or greater.

Winter Storm⁴¹

A “Winter Storm” is either a “watch” or a “warning” classification for the National Weather Service (NWS). If the “warning” became a reality, then it is recorded in the NCEI Storm Events database. A “Winter Storm Warning,” then, is issued by the National Weather Service when a winter storm is producing or is forecast to produce heavy snow or significant ice accumulations. The criteria for this warning can vary from place to place.
