Financial report:

At the end of October, we had \$1.45 million cash in the bank. Through October, 33% of the year, we are 18% spent of the total budget. The total spent figure is being dragged down by project subcontracts which continue to be delayed. Our internal cost categories of salary, fringe, indirect, and operating are at or near target at this time.

The **Executive Review** report was presented by Director Ben Hale and approved with a motion made to accept and seconded by Judge Robbie Williams and Mr. Mark Gooch. Motion carried. The report included the following projects:

Old Business:

Dr. Sherry Zylka was asked by Director Hale to give an update of the Solar Panel Project underway in Martin County. Dr Zylka reported the PSC approved the project and Edelen Renewables is working in conjunction with BSCTC. BSCTC is working with the Solar Project to offer a training class in Solar Panel Installation. This would allow participants, upon completion, to be Certified Solar Panel Technician. Within the next 2 weeks, Dr. Zylka expects job descriptions to be released for the upcoming job fair related to this project. She also reported the hiring of 50 people at the new business Appalachian Tank, former location of the Silver Liner. Some of the recent welding students of the Mayo Campus of BSCTC will be applying for these positions.

Chairman McKenzie thanked Dr. Zylka for her involvement in the surrounding communities.

New Business: STAFF REPORTS

CEDS Department – Joe Jacobs

The 2021 Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) update for 2021 has completed its 30-day public comment period and is being presented to the board for final approval. This update is the last annual update in the existing CEDS 5-year cycle. The process of drafting an entirely new 5-year Strategy for the region will begin after the first of the calendar year.

Three members of the Community and Economic Development Department received their Kentucky Community Development Block Grant Certified Administrator certifications this month. Kentucky and the US Department of Housing and Urban Development require certification to administer CDBG-funded projects. The training course, exam, and certificate program are administered by the Kentucky Department for Local Government. The three newly certified administrators are Matt Scofield, Jacob Anderson, and Braydon Sode.

Chairman McKenzie gave his congratulations to Braydon Sode, Matt Scoville, and Jacob Anderson in receiving their CDBG certification.

BIG SANDY AREA AGENCY ON AGING AND INDEPENDENT LIVING – Liz Hamilton

- Ms. Hamilton reports since the last meeting 10/25/2021 11/19/2021 there have been 16,270 meals served in the 5 county region.
 Martin Area kitchen has now moved into their new location at the Varia Mountain site in Martin.
- Floyd, Johnson and Magoffin Senior Centers are back open to the public for services. Pike and Martin are watching the COVID numbers to determine when they will reopen.

- Update of the National Family Caregiver Program: Program consists of adult family members or other informal caregivers age 19+ providing care to individuals 60 years of age or older, grandparents raising grandchildren, older relatives age 55+ are providing care to children under the age of 19, and older relatives, including parents age 55+providing care to adults age19-59 with disabilities.
- Respite Program currently has 19 caregivers utilizing the program. This is a voucher program system that offers temporary substitute support for care recipients in order to provide brief periods of relief or rest for the caregivers.
- Since 07/01/2021 this aging program has provided 9 caregivers with goods and services to help compliment the care provided by the caregivers. For example, supplies such as: depends, bed chux, bed sore medication, mouth swabs, medical gowns, pain reliever, and ensure.
- There have been 3 grandparents with 6 grandchildren who were provided with supplemental services. An example of those are mainly school clothing.

• GIS – Jamie Pinson

- Finished up Johnson County System-wide Review. Magoffin, Elkhorn City, Martin and Wheelwright remain; Wheelwright is supposed to have it on their December agenda.
- Preparing Centerlines maps we host online for Pike, Floyd and Johnson County road departments.
- Map work for Regional Transportation Planning Program deliverables.
- Mapping for Projects Dept. needs (Landslide Susceptibility, Flood Maps, Topo Maps, etc.).
