
You're receiving this email because our records indicate your school is located within 1,200 feet of Vector Pipeline, a 42-inch unodorized natural gas pipeline.

Hello, I'm Justin Ritter. As a member of Vector Pipeline's Public Awareness team, I want to share important information with you about the ways you, as a school official, can protect your students, faculty and staff by promoting safe digging on your campus or within your district.

The first step is to call 811! 811 is a fast, free nationwide service designed to keep you safe when digging or excavating. It also applies to other activities that may occur during campus maintenance or improvements. (This includes planting trees, installing utilities and constructing sidewalks, steps, parking lots and buildings.)

Calling 811 results in a damage-free project 99 percent of the time. You can help protect your students, faculty and staff from the effects of an underground utility strike by seeing that anyone involved in planning or conducting soil-disturbing activities at your school calls 811 before beginning.
