Dear People of Grace;

I have been reminded lately that coincidences often can be received as movements of the Spirit of God in our lives. Here is an example.

April 23-26, I was in Kennewick WA for our Synod Assembly. By Friday evening, around 250 people from across the synod were gathered to be Church together. We met at First Lutheran Church, where my good friend Pastor JJ Dygert is serving. Those folks invested a great deal of time getting the place ready, setting up chairs and tables, clearing rooms, preparing refreshments.

The widow of a recently deceased pastor of our synod brought many boxes of his books for giveaway. We were invited to give a donation of money, all proceeds going to Lutheran World Relief. I visited the book room periodically, wondering if I “needed” anything. Disciplining myself to take three books, I dropped a twenty and went happily on my way.

One of these was “A Spirituality of Fundraising” by Henri Nouwen. Ever since I started reading his books in college, I enjoyed Nouwen’s spiritual language and gentle style. I had heard this book referenced somewhere recently and felt this was a happy coincidence.

Fundraising is proclaiming what we believe in such a way that we offer other people an opportunity to participate with us in our vision and mission. Fundraising is precisely the opposite of begging. When we seek to raise funds we are not saying, “Please, could you help us out because lately it’s been hard.” Rather, we are declaring, “we have a vision that is amazing and exciting. We are inviting you to invest yourself through the resources that God has given you – your energy, your prayers, and your money – in this work to which God has called us.” Our invitation is clear and confident because we trust that our vision and mission are like “trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season, and their leaves do not wither” (pp. 16-17)

Two days later, Intern Pastor Laura and I were on retreat with other interns and supervisors. There was a presentation given by Grace Pomroy, Director of the Stewardship Leaders Program at Luther Seminary. At the end of her presentation, she gifted each of us with two stewardship books, one of them being “A Spirituality of Fundraising” by Henri Nouwen.

Now, I have two copies of a book that had recently been on my radar. I will steward them well and give one copy away! Happy, Spirit-coincidences are such a delight. The short verse at the top of my article is a beautiful way to prepare for ministry down the road. Why give of ourselves for ministry? Love is our aim.

### Words of wisdom for Eastertide from St. Augustine

*“Here, ... amidst the dangers and the trials we and others must sing Alleluia, “for God is faithful and [God] will not let you be tempted beyond your strength,” as Paul says. So then we must also sing here Alleluia. [We are] still sinners, but God is faithful. Scripture does not say, “[God] will not let you be tempted,” but, “[God] will not let you be tempted beyond your strength, but with the temptation will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.” ... How happy will be our shout of Alleluia there, how carefree, how secure from any adversary, where there is no enemy, where no friend perishes. There praise is offered to God, and here, too, but here it is by [those] who are anxious, there by [those] who are free from care, here by [those] who must die, there by [those] who will live for ever. Here praise is offered in hope, there by [those] who enjoy the reality, here by [those] who are pilgrims on the way, there by [those] who have reached their own country.*

*So, [friends], now let us sing Alleluia, not in the enjoyment of heavenly rest, but to sweeten our toil. Sing as travellers sing along the road: but keep on walking. Solace your toil by singing – do not yield to idleness. Sing but keep on walking. What do I mean by “walking”? I mean, press on from good to better. The apostle says there are some who go from bad to worse. But if you press on, you keep on walking. Go forward then in virtue, in true faith and right conduct. Sing up – and keep on walking.*

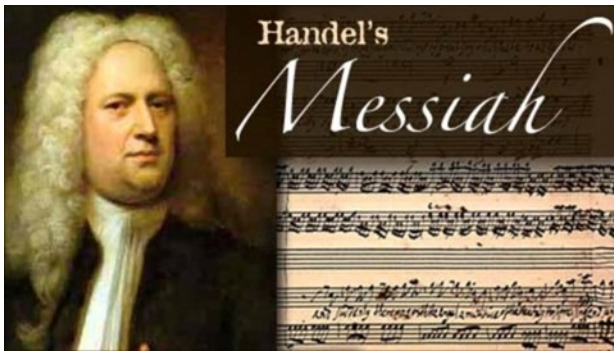


## Confirmation Sunday May 24, 2026

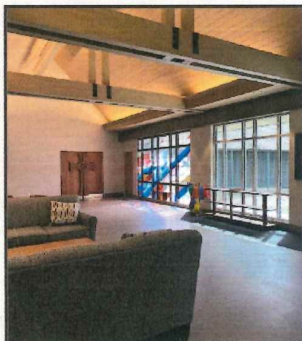
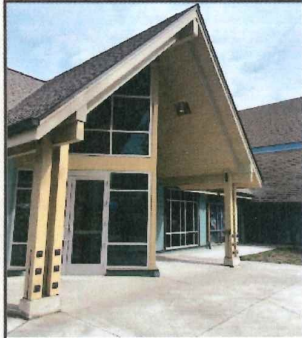

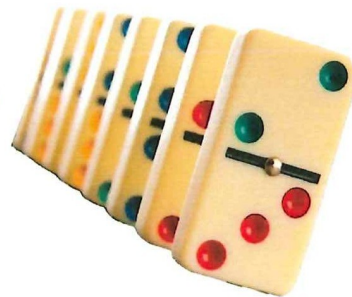

## Benevolence Highlight: WHS Panther House

At the Social Concerns Team February Meeting, the team elected to have Wenatchee High School's (WHS) Panther House as a Benevolence for 2026. A quarterly payment of \$450 will be given to the WHS Panther House to help students and their families with basic needs. The Panther House is located by the counseling offices at WHS.

The Panther House provides essential support to approximately 100 students and their families each month by supplying food, hygiene items, clothing, graduation gear, student fees and food. The monies help ensure students' basic needs are met so they can focus on their education and well-being.

Funding support allows Panther House to continue serving students and families who rely on this resource and ensure that no student goes without essential items due to financial hardship.

## TREASURER TALK: 3/31/26 Results

At the end of the first quarter of 2026 total offerings were \$126,889 compared to \$129,543 in 2025. Interest earned for this period in 2026 was \$5,013 compared to \$23,185 in 2025. The 2026 budgeted amount for offerings was \$102,258 and \$3,500 for interest. Expenses were \$124,734 versus the budgeted amount of \$138,647. Net Operating Income of \$7,168 compares favorably to projected budget deficit (\$32,889) but we are behind compared to 2025.

1. Preparations are underway for the May 9 open house. It will involve guided tours of the new facilities, refreshments, and presentations by various congregation musical groups.
2. Council discussed a possible capital fundraising drive to provide for needed items--such as new windows in the office wing--that were not completed in the recent remodeling (which was largely funded by the Fox gift and not by congregational members).
3. Building and Grounds have several short-term goals in association with the recent renovations: emptying the storage container (which has begun); seeding the lawns and installing a sprinkler system; and purchasing blinds for the office windows.
4. The Arts Team presented ideas for the placement of art works in the remodeled building areas and the sanctuary.
