# From the desk of Pastor James

For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another.

(Romans 12:4-5)

#### Dear people of Grace;

I invite you to think deeply about community. There's a man I came to know in my first call. He grew up in Tanzania. He immigrated to the U.S. many years ago and started a family here, putting down roots in his new community. I came to know his wife and sons very well. I had been increasingly interested in the theme of community as a way to speak to the isolation that happens so often in our society. I said to him that he must have a lot of insight about the topic of community, because I know that the culture of his home country places much more emphasis on togetherness, on living entire lives as a group like a village, certainly as an extended family. I mentioned to him that he must really appreciate living with community as such an important concept. He remarked, "Yes, but it's also very difficult." You see, the socioeconomic disparities between the U.S. and Tanzania are so vast. Extended family back in Tanzania rely upon him to provide for their children's education and other expenses. He and his family live quite humbly in this country. So much of what they earn goes to loved ones, extended relatives because well, that's how it goes. That's how their society is ordered. In fact, as he was growing up, he was a recipient of the combined sacrifice and hard work of his own family so that he could go to school, eventually immigrating to this country and receiving a doctorate in biology.

Community is a beautiful thing. We receive compassion in community. We receive gentle, loving care in community. There are so many blessings, including companionship and friendship. We also acknowledge that community is difficult. We say things we don't mean, and we are lucky if the one offended brings it up to us so we can have a chance at reconciliation. Likewise, sometimes we say things we do you mean, realizing when it's too late that our attitudes aren't very healthy or helpful. Sometimes we "let something slip," not having been careful to use flowery language to mask our true position or attitude. Also, we have a responsibility for one another. There are choices we sometimes must make for the good of someone in our community for the sake of the greater good. Often our choices involve a personal sacrifice for the sake of someone else in our community.

Community is a challenge, an opportunity, to get underneath the words, to get behind them and examine where in our heart God is speaking. If we are one body in Christ and individually members one of another, then *who* we are toward one another is also *how* we are to ourselves.

We have many things going on at Grace, opportunities to gather together, invitations to be part of groups centered around music or meal, learning, hanging out with one another, or joining in prayer, or service in the community. With so much happening, a sense of connectedness between things can happen. Over the last several months our leadership has done some work to focus on, and to reflect, core values we want to claim for our congregation. These three came to the surface: Worship, Community, Service.

#### Listen with the Ear of the Heart, St. Benedict

From the desk of I was blessed to attend the Bishop's Convocation in Boise Idaho that was held October 4-6. It was my first Convocation and an exciting time for me to learn some of the organizational structures of the Eastern Washington-Idaho Synod. In Minnesota we have six Synods that represent the ELCA Churches. I was surprised to learn the vast geographical area that is represented by the Eastern Washington-Idaho Synod. I also

had the opportunity to listen to Bishop Kristen Kuempel talk about her vision for our Synod as we plan for the future. She is full of energy and ready to strive for positive changes in the operations of the church.

This year's Convocation was centered on specialized ministries. We were fortunate to have a panel of seven people and two military chaplains speak on how God works through them to serve people outside of the church setting. These areas of specialized ministry included campus ministry, nursing home chaplaincy, hospital chaplaincy, military chaplaincy, deacons/deaconess, and associates in ministry.

Several of these positions are held by people who have chosen to study in the area of Word and Service compared to Word and Sacrament. Ministers of Word and Service provide a ministry representing the life of Christ by providing services that nurture and equip people to live a life of witness and service to God. Ministers of Word and Sacrament are also people who are committed to Christ, strong in their faith beliefs, preach God's Word, and celebrate the sacraments. These ministers are required, in the ELCA, to be ordained ministers. Both are committed to the four principles of the ELCA: we are church, we are Lutheran, we are church together, and we are church for the sake of the world.

They shared information on how to interact with and support veterans and their families, families and patients in the hospital setting, the elderly in nursing home settings, people and children who are victims of domestic abuse, how to reach out to our young adults who are involved in post-secondary education and ministry for those who are incarcerated. They shared real life experiences and how God has called them to this type of ministry.

For me, this experience opened my eyes to all of the opportunities for Grace Lutheran Church to engage in community service based on the four principles of the ELCA. We are doing many great things here at Grace, and I look forward to following the leadership of Bishop Kristen Kuempel as we move forward with the many ministries of our Church.

There was one request made of the member churches of the Eastern Washington-Idaho Synod. We are being asked to pray for our Bishop, our Synod, our churches, and our ELCA Church Wide Assembly. The emphasis on the word our is to remind us that we are a proud member of this amazing community that represents 500 years of God's grace in action.

As for Mike and I, we have settled in nicely in the Wenatchee Valley. Thank you for continuing to check on us and make sure we are doing okay. We are blessed to be a part of a loving community of God's children. God's peace.

there are, the more we can band together to do God's work.



#### Dear Christian Friends,

We wish to thank you for your generous gift to the Marfaleh Sumo Academy in Gbarnya, Liberia. You made a major difference. This school began in 2006 following fifteen years of civil war to meet the needs of children who lost one or both parents in that war. We also wanted to encourage the Christian churches in the area in bringing the knowledge of the love of God to the children who will ultimately form the Liberia of the future. About 200 children are able to get a school year quality education and a Christian presence because we care!

The school continues to be a major center for this "in the bush" small community and the surrounding villages. Money sent from the USA is primarily used to provide funding for the teachers, supplies, transportation costs, and operating expenses. However, this past year the school was able to build, from mud bricks and zinc roofing, a second building to help house the classrooms and a gathering space for the children.




Pictured to the left is the closing ceremony for the students on July 16, 2017 for the 2016-2017 school year. Their teachers and the principal are pictured to the right.
