Dear people of Grace;

I invite you to think deeply about worship. I was encouraged the other day when one of our youth shared with me that they are keeping a list of favorite hymns on their “notes” app in their phone! The list is about 20 hymns deep so far! The youth said, “I love how deep the lyrics are.”

We have many things going on at Grace, opportunities to gather together, invitations to be part of groups centered around music or meal, learning, hanging out with one another, or joining in prayer, or service in the community. With so much happening, a sense of connectedness between things can happen. Over the last several months our leadership has done some work to focus the lens and see what we do as a way to reflect core values we want to name. These three came to the surface: Worship, Community, Service.

Below, you’ll see what we have been saying about worship. These statements are meant to be part of an ongoing conversation among us, with the hope that we are seeing both a reflection of who we’ve been over the years, and a path for continuing our journey together. All three values should help us have forward movement and help us imagine what “going deeper” could look like in our congregation.

- Worship is a verb. We gather to worship the living God.
- Worshiping is rooted in God’s Word, and is Gospel-centered.
- Worshipers of all generations are full participants.
- We come to worship with our whole selves, expecting that God meets us through the gifts of:
 - ◊ Prayer;
 - ◊ Preaching;
 - ◊ Sacraments of the Table and Font;
 - ◊ Music; and
 - ◊ Relationship, where we belong to God and to one another.
- As we worship, we acknowledge our local and global community.
- Our worship helps us experience:
 - ◊ Gratitude to God;
 - ◊ A challenge to grow and mature in Christ;
 - ◊ Comfort in the midst of pain or loss; and
 - ◊ Healing and reconciliation, in ourselves and in our relationships.
- In all of this, we are being shaped and taught to be a living expression of the crucified and risen Christ.

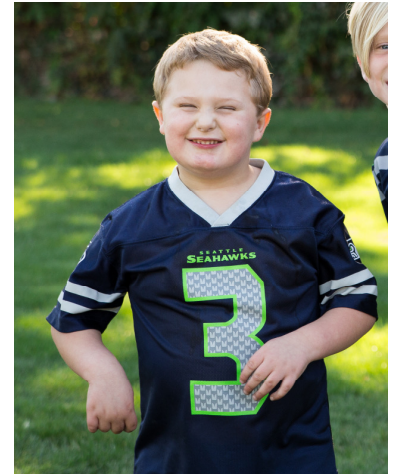
