## A Daily Friendship

*“Love one another... ..lay down (your) life for (your) friends... ..You are my friends if you do what I command you... ..I do not call you servants any longer... ..but I have called you friends... ..You did not choose me, but I chose you...” (Jesus in John 15:12-16)*

Dear people of Grace; The gospel reading for May 6<sup>th</sup> has Jesus, the Light of the World, God-in-the-flesh, calling us friends and commanding us to love one another, even laying down our lives for one another. Pretty remarkable, if you ask me. Friend of God. Wow. “God” and “Friend” might be a natural pairing for *you*, but the *world* doesn’t tip in that direction. If the loudest voices in the world think of God much at all, God is understood as more a source of power, a permission-giver, one who blesses or sanctions, anointing actions and attitudes that may or may not originate in God. I think these approaches miss something very important. Laying down one’s life and being friends calls us to a different way: it’s much more about a relationship and much less about getting something done.

You have a daily friendship in Christ Jesus. It has a “two-way-ness” that’s often forgotten.

Author Priscilla Long, in *Minding the Muse: A Handbook for Painters, Composers, Writers, and Other Creators*, writes about the daily work of returning to the creative process. This speaks to me because I see friendship with Christ as a relationship of freedom and creativity. Please read this quote with your daily friendship with Christ in mind (and, don’t get hung up on the word “work,” as if you need to earn your relationship. We are people who live by grace given to us as a work of the Holy Spirit, not our own efforts):

It’s not about working fast. It’s about returning to the work day after day, inquiring of it what it needs and giving it what it asks for. It’s a conversation, a dialogue, at times an argument. It’s a relationship. As long as we keep steady, keep the faith, keep on returning to the work, the work will keep on giving us back what we need to complete it.

We will soon be in the time after Pentecost, a long season meant to help us grow in Christ. I hope to develop a better habit of nurturing the daily friendship I have in Christ, to get a sense more and more of the freedom and creativity this friendship opens me up to. I’ve already learned that my daily friendship in Christ manifests almost immediately in my friendships with you.

Home is... Throughout our lives, we have many different places we call home. We have our childhood home, church home, family home, vacation home, nursing home, foster home, first home, and lake home to name a few.

All of these are physical structures that we inhabit at different times in our lives; however, the home I am writing about is the emotional *feeling* of home. It reminds me of a quote from Saint Augustine, *What is grace? I know until you ask me; when you ask me, I do not know.* We can all describe the physical structure of a home we have lived in, but can we describe the emotional feeling of being home?

Each of these homes has many memories, some more important than others. If you are reading this letter, there is a very good chance you have a place you call your church home. I have attended more than one church in my life, but there is only one I call *home*.

What has inspired this letter is the many stories people have shared about *being home* when they are at a church. Recently I met with a woman who came to Grace to discuss her father's memorial service. She spoke of her memories growing up here at Grace. After I heard several wonderful memories, she asked me if we could go to the sanctuary. As we entered and she walked toward the baptismal font, she stated, "This is like coming home." As we stood there, she shared more childhood stories of her time at Grace with her family.

Another lady I visited with at a care facility would tell me every time that I visited that she missed her church home, but when her life came to an end she would be returning home to Grace Lutheran Church. And she did just that.

Most people tell me about being baptized, confirmed, and/or married here. They talk about where they sat in church, who the pastor was at the time, the choirs, and the fellowship. They talk about the good times and the bad times. But the greatest part is when they say, "this is home."

My belief is that this warm feeling of peace and home come to us through the Holy Spirit. The Spirit breathes life and breath into us at times when we are not expecting. It may be when you enter the church. It may be when you hear the words of a song that moves you emotionally. It may be a word the preacher says that grabs hold of your attention. It may be the people sitting around you that have their own faith journey story that keeps bringing them back to this place some call the church while others call it *home*, and it may be the *peace be with you* they receive from their neighbor sitting next to them in church. I could fill pages with stories of people that Grace Lutheran Church has been their home for most, if not all, of their lives, and pages of stories of people who have found their way back to the church and upon entering, tell their story with tears in their eyes of returning home.

When I first arrived at Grace Lutheran Church in the fall of 2017, the first thing I said when walking into the sanctuary was, "This is just like home." It was such a relief to be in a church building that resembled my home church in Minnesota in so many ways. Then the people arrived and the love, compassion, and kindness for my husband and me were overwhelming. Grace has become more than a physical structure, it has become *home*.




