

#### The Sanctuary – a Different Kind of Space

Dear friends in Christ,

Wood and brick, glass and cloth, paper and pipes come together among many more things to provide space for an activity we call worship. Ceramics are refreshed regularly with bread, water, wine and juice, oil is topped off in our candles and minus the human and mechanical activity that enliven the space, the sanctuary is silent. Those things are not holy in themselves.

Those things are not holy in themselves, but become sacred or holy through the activity of our worship - which is the movement of the Spirit of Christ through the Body of Christ, the Church. I believe that in our worship we don't separate ourselves from the world, but really go deeper into the world and all of what God gives us from such a generous and gracious hand.

What makes the sanctuary a different kind of space? It's the activity, the intention that we infuse into it as a congregation. There's a direction, a purpose to our gathering together. One could even say that our worship and our sanctuary give us an opportunity to have an experience that's at the same time undiluted human and divine. These thoughts make the space abuzz with agitated expectation and peaceful calm, at the same time. I want to share a few suggestions with you about your use of the sanctuary and your participation in worship at Grace.

- 1. Hold a time of quiet in the last few minutes before worship. The prelude is prepared to minister to you and help the space and your spirit come abuzz.
- 2. Watch for someone who looks like they don't know what's going on. You can be a host and start a new friendship.
- 3. Don't let yourself worry about getting it right. We prepare as leaders and musicians. We practice and pray so we can be a foundation under your worship. We will goof up, and it all gets covered in grace.
- 4. Be eager to hear the Word.
- 5. Watch and listen for connections that happen between hymn verses (even the musical accompaniment!) and the biblical text, or events in the world, or the changes of the seasons around us.
- 6. The stained-glass windows tell many stories. Notice something new.

# From the desk of Intern Wayne

As we made our way across the United States and US90 late in August, we had a GPS, a smartphone, and a national map from the AAA. The trip revealed a wide range of

geography and geology. What surprised us is the dramatic role water plays in how the landscape formed. Janet and I were constantly reminded of water's effect as we drove into Rapid City, SD and the Black Hills around the Missouri River, followed rivers through Montana and the Grand Tetons, enjoying the lake at Coeur D'Alene, ID and after miles of high desert across the Columbia Plateau plunging into its dramatic, carved valleys. It could be a Hollywood movie and soundtrack all by itself.

All that carved by two hydrogen molecules and one oxygen molecule (and millions of years)! We celebrate God's actions and activity in forming Creation, the Earth, and all that is in it. The power of water is also evident in our weather. It changes rapidly in some cases when we see storms, floods, hurricanes and tornados affect lives and the neighborhoods around us. The water was here before humans populated the land. In a sense, we are the visitors, the intruders, in our lands. Water is always on the minds of folks here in the valley. It is vital to life, the economy, and the future.

Our youth service on Rally Day used the gospel story from John 4:4-30 of the Samaritan woman at the well. We hear Jesus offer the woman **Living Water**, the Christ, as he reveals himself to be the Messiah. Living Water! How we take that for granted! The living water that Jesus offers us is as vital to our lives as the water we drink each day. Are we drinking in enough Living Water? Do we reflect on how the Living Water forms us, renews and refreshes us, "carves" us into unique people, no longer part of the landscape but separated out and placed in Creation for God's purposes?

Heard recently: wishing for... "that smell when the rain first hits the ground." We also yearn for Living Water, the only true water we can put our trust, which sustains us and each other. You will find it in church as we celebrate our Baptism, in Faith Formation as we share in learning and deepen our faith, and in the world as we share our special story of faith with others.

As I learn more about Grace Lutheran Church and Wenatchee (and beyond), I become more excited about the mission and community we all share. I can't wait to work alongside all of you as we renew ourselves in the Living Water of Jesus Christ and share our gifts with the world.


### **Together at Grace**
