

The Lectionary – a Different Kind of Reading List

Dear friends in Christ,

Think of the many reading lists that exist. Bestseller lists, summer reading lists, lists for courses and of course personal reading lists keep the reader pursuing knowledge, fictional adventures, and more. I have a book by Eugene Peterson (known for his translation of the Bible called The Message) titled "Take and Read". The book is an annotated reading list. It's a book about books.

The Church has a reading list called a "Lectionary." An old Latin word for "reading," a companion definition would be "to pick out words" to be read in worship. As a minister of Word and Sacrament, my calling is to pay close attention to the Word. Bible readings are assigned through a reading list called the "Revised Common Lectionary." It takes us three years to complete the whole cycle; when we finish with Year C on Christ the King Sunday, we begin Year A the next Sunday, the first Sunday in Advent.

By choosing to use a lectionary, we are joining with many, many people we don't see but who are also hearing the same verses. Gail Ramshaw, a professor of religion at La Salle University in Philadelphia, wrote in *A Three-Year Banquet*: "By committing ourselves to the discipline of the lectionary, we acknowledge that we are not Lone Rangers riding off on our own horse, but rather we join with Christians around the world in a common identity and a common purpose. We relinquish personal preferences for the greater goal of common practice. We stand together, wherever we meet, hearing the same gospel each week." Also, "Always in the Sunday liturgy there is a balance between two things. The simplicity of the bread and wine is held next to the complexity of the three readings... there is far more than we can do justice to on any single hearing. We'll have to feast at that banquet again, and again, and again."

Here are a few things I encourage you to consider with the lectionary in mind.

- 1. The prayer of the day is meant to help get a sense of a theme for the day. It's also a way to be opened up to receive the Word of God through the reading.
- 2. Consider just listening to the voice of the reader and letting the tone, tenor and tempo of the reader's voice be part of your interpretation of the Word.
- 3. Be hungry for what God is prompting in you, in your faith community and in other circles through the Word. Seek out the gospel through the hearing of scripture.
- 4. Use the sermon as an opportunity for God to shape your faith and sharpen your sense of calling in the world.
- 5. Be ok with silence that you might experience around the readings, or at any time during worship.

Welcome the Season of **Thinks** giving

It hardly seems fair that November is here. I was just getting used to October-the crisper air and the changing leaves, the light falling just so on the mountains. The excitement of Halloween! Candy! Pumpkins! Oktoberfest! Now we await the change back from

Daylight Savings Time to plain old Pacific Time. We hold our breath and get ready to vote on November 6th. Of course, there are the Christmas decorations for sale in every store. November seems to be... in the way? Awkward? Unlovable?

In November, we approach the ending of the liturgical calendar, the finality of our church year. Ordinary Time is almost complete. We have Thanksgiving to look forward to, but that seems to be more about football game plans, food, and getting people home and then back again safely. Hardly a time to relax.

I propose that we change November to the Season of Thinksgiving. We ought to give ourselves time to stop and THINK about what we're doing and what we are supposed to be about as Kingdom people. I will say up front that it will be hard, very hard, to do this intentionally. The time will slip through our fingers as we will arrive in December wondering how we will get through "The Holidays" in one piece. Let's try, though!

For Thinksgiving, we might start with a few questions:

- Do we make the same choices as last year? Or Think about better ones?
- What will we value most this coming year?
- What will we change to make this coming time better and more meaningful?

I'll bring forward one problem that happened to my home congregation. Tradition said we had to collect food and make baskets to give to people at Thanksgiving. We got a late start on finding families to receive food baskets. It seems that every church, school, and community organization was trying to do the same thing at the same time. Stories emerged of needy families being inundated with too much good food as well-meaning folks from the church delivered yet another basket or box of food.

Jesus always asks us to think a bit differently. The church's solution was to address the issue of hunger in our community. We chose to act differently and not be nostalgic about Thanksgiving itself. There was a Noisy Offering for World Hunger all month, efforts to learn more about food programs in the area, and a collection of things like hats and coats that offer more lasting gifts to people in a colder climate. We could give thanks without giving food baskets when everyone else did. All we did was THINK about helping others instead of doing what made us feel good.

Tell me your stories! Let me know what you "THINK" can be done differently going into our new church year. Help me know about opportunities and needs in the community that might be overlooked or forgotten. Let's find new ways to do the things we know need to get done, serving others as we love and serve God.

Vanco Services is the company that administers the plan and Thrivent's only connection is to pay the administrative fee for us. Thrivent has no access to the names of people who are signed up for the service.

And it is easy to sign up. Just see Roxanne, the Finance Manager, and she will help you fill out and sign a simple form. Please bring a voided copy of one of your checks and she will do the rest. You can make monthly payments on any day of the month except the 31st since not every month has 31 days. You may also make weekly, biweekly, quarterly, and annual payments if you wish. Your payment can be credited to the budget and other accounts that you may wish to fund. The charge can be made to either your checking or savings account, or to a credit or debit card.
