The Assembly – a Different Kind of Gathering

Dear friends in Christ,

I've been in gatherings of many types where I'm not sure if I fit or belong. How about you? There can be a feeling of awkwardness, sometimes also a feeling of being judged by strangers, or perhaps "sized up". Whether it's a club, class or conversation circle, the same dynamic can be present. Groups are not often up-front enough to clearly communicate who they are expecting to be part of their group. This is something we are taking steps to accomplish as the people of Grace. I assume that we all "feel the room" to some extent until our comfort level rises and we can feel assured of our place. When there's a vacuum in the messaging, the newcomer is left to feel the room even more. Then of course, unspoken norms and rules are expressed and it is up to the newcomer to "get it." As we practice community as a congregation, we have a responsibility to get underneath our spoken and unspoken expectations, for the sake of Christ and his mission, and be intentional.

When people enter the sanctuary at Grace they feel the room. Because we are a congregation, we gather at various times in order to worship. Because we believe that God has welcomed us, part of our natural movement is to turn toward old and new friends, all people, and represent God by also welcoming. But let's not lose sight of the fact that our reception of one another is "penultimate", not quite the ultimate purpose for gathering:

"When the assembly comes to the living Word, Jesus Christ, and to the gifts of baptism and the Lord's Supper, it discovers that the assembly itself is not doing the most important work at all. God is the one who above all is present and active in worship, working wonders among us and in us." (from The Sunday Assembly, Evangelical Lutheran Worship).

My invitation to you:

- Consider using the word "assembly" to mean the congregation gathered in worship. It highlights the sense of assembling and dispersing as part of the weekly flow of the congregation.
- Reflect a bit before you assemble with the rest of us. What are you releasing to God? Where is healing necessary? What about your world and your culture do you want God to address and make new?

Save the date! Pastor Ernie Memorial Fun Run and Walk


