Summer Worship Schedule Begins June 7

For the summer months, we will have one Sunday morning worship service at **9:30 a.m.**, beginning **June 7**.

“For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope, for who hopes for what one already sees? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.” (Romans 8:24-25)

Dear People of Grace;

As I read and pray through scriptures for the next several weeks, there is a theme that is often touched-upon: hope. “If we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.”

What does hope look like for us here as God’s gathered people at Grace? How about using this article as a prompt for your own prayer life, conversations with other people of Grace, your own journaling or forms of art? What are the hopes that arise from us?

Related to this theme of hope, I get a sense from these scriptures that sometimes hopes are buried deep in the rest of life. Think of the parable of the Sower and the Seeds. The farmer personifies hope, to the point of being really quite careless when casting seeds about, some landing on rocky soil, some among thorns, and some among good soil. If the farmer worried about efficient use of seed, there would be much more care given to where the seed fell. The farmer, however, is an agent of hope. Even the good seed falling on good soil becomes buried. The harvest comes much later. The between-time is a time of patient hope.

We should recognize that hope is adaptable. Hope’s contours change with every passing experience. It would be convenient if an original hope were fixed and set, and all we need to do is hang on tight while hope is challenged and put under strain. Hope, however, is contextual. We learn more about ourselves and the world around us, and our prayer is that our hopes will rise to the occasion. Hope gives us permission to grow into a deeper understanding of God. Our hope is in Christ, who meets us each day with the steadfast love of God. It might get buried, but the roots of faith can then grow deeper. We know and confess that God is making all things new.

Sunday Coffee Fellowship Update

Currently we have very few volunteers serving during Sunday morning fellowship. There is a sign-up sheet in the Social Hall. It is best to have 2 people.

Below is what the job entails:

- Come early enough to make coffee and fill the pumper pots.
- Plate the treats. There are usually treats in the freezer or the server can bring what they wish to offer.
- Put out the treats, drinks, pitchers of water, cups, glasses, etc.
- Replenish drinks, as necessary.
- Clean up.



If a volunteer would appreciate instruction on the sanitizer, dishwasher or coffee maker that will be arranged.

Special Request: If you are bringing a cake, donuts or any special treat that you want to be served on a given Sunday, please notify the person signed up for that day in advance.

As we share our beautiful, remodeled kitchen, please respectfully observe the following:

- Food left for a designated event needs to be labeled as such.
- Leftovers (especially in the refrigerator) need to be dated and labeled for general use.

When leaving:

- Be sure nothing is in front of counter that will block the descent of the fire door.
- Close door from the kitchen to the fellowship hall.
- Close the doors from the fellowship hall to the narthex.
- Check that all doors leading outside are locked: from the kitchen to the patio, from the fellowship hall to the patio, and from the fellowship hall to the back staircase.

Discernment Initiative Group

In March of 2025, Church Council passed the “[Discernment Initiative Group Resolution](#).” The goal of that group was to actively engage the congregation in a variety of listening activities and then summarize congregational interest in particular ministries. The summary was to be provided to Council and to the Budget Committee for their estimates of the cost of the ministries (time, talent, and resources). [The Discernment Report](#) was printed and posted and circulated by the Discernment Group and by Council last fall. It is still available for review and Council continues to reference it. Both documents are available on the Resource page of our website, and copies will be available in the Fellowship Hall after services on June 7.

“Discernment in this context may be best understood as a group process centered in prayer and conversation of the congregation embracing the calling of the Holy Spirit for our ministries in upcoming months and years. Before arriving at a commitment about what to do, the congregation will be encouraged to explore who God is calling us to be.”

The Discernment process is not decision making. It is listening. It is listening to the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, and sharing what we hear with one another and with church leadership.

In December 2025, Council with the leadership of the Budget Committee drew up a budget that was presented to and passed by the congregation in January 2026. That budget reflected the discernment of the congregation as reported to Council and Budget Committee.

Discernment is an ongoing activity of Grace Lutheran Church. We listen for the voice of the Holy Spirit and seek the direction of God’s calling in all our ministries. May Father, Son, and Holy Spirit bless and guide our efforts.

SOCIAL CONCERNS TEAM

Benevolence Highlight: YWCA Voucher Program

YWCA North Central Washington (NCW) facilitates a voucher program via the YWCA NCW Thrift Store that serves approximately 1700 low/extremely low-income individuals, and those experiencing homelessness/housing insecurities per year. The vouchers are distributed through a network of over two dozen local partner agencies such as CAFÉ and the Salvation Army. Each voucher is worth \$30.00 of wearables (clothes/shoes/jackets/hats/etc.) and is assigned per person. For example, when a family of five receives this resource, they receive five vouchers.

Social Concerns Team and Young Families

The Social Concerns Team will be working with families to help children and youth in the congregation be more involved in community service projects and fellowship. For the summer months, we will have a “T@G Picnic” each Wednesday at 5:30 p.m. This will be a time of food, fun, and fellowship. Our first meal will consist of hot dogs, chips, a drink, and cookies.

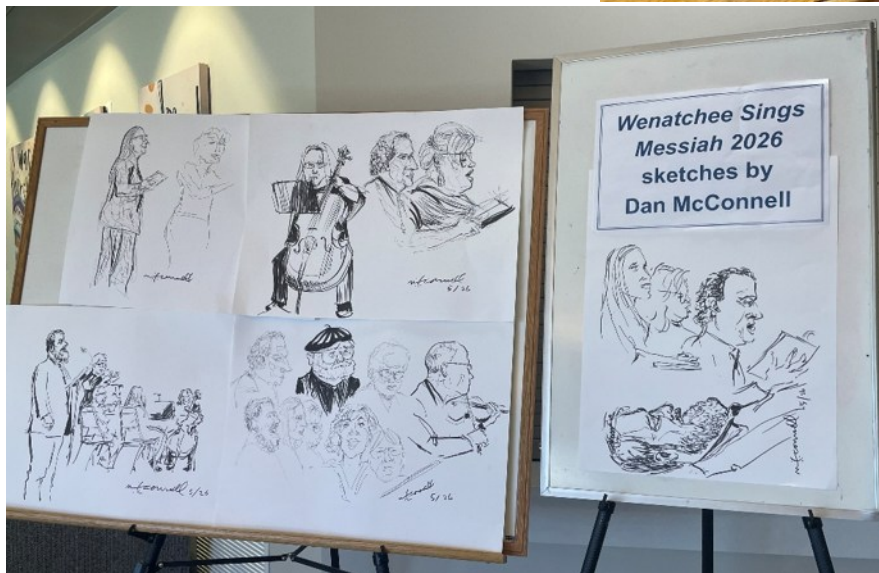
