Foxes have holes... birds have nests... the Son of Man has nowhere. (From Luke 9)

Dear People of Grace;

I was up on a ladder, leaning against my house several weeks ago. Birds had claimed some real estate in the corner of a rain gutter. Last year, I thought I had fixed that problem with a few patches of metal screen, but their genetic memory found a way to return to the place of their birth.

It gets more interesting. These gutters have a leaf guard which should have also deterred these little sparrows (juncos, I think). No such luck. They had discovered in late winter a small opening; and once they had a way in, they had a lovely apartment for the next generation. I removed the leaf guard to investigate. Soon, I was scooping out gobs of seasonal grasses, leaves, anything that could have been packed in for bedding. I traced their building material to a downward-pointing elbow in the gutter and found it completely dammed up with mud. There was no way water could have drained to the ground. After complaining about these juncos, I realized they had accomplished an amazing feat of engineering. More scooping, poking and flushing with a garden hose, and finally the way was clear. I reassembled the rain gutter, added more screen, and will have to wait and see how it will go next spring.

Birds forage for home-building material. Their nests are made of the stuff of earth, indeed, of earth itself. Perhaps you have held an abandoned nest and marveled at the craftsmanship involved. Woven clippings from the yard packed and sealed with mud, these tiny houses must require long hours of labor to prepare for birth.

Foxes, birds, and the Son of Man. In the gospel of Luke, Jesus is approached by many would-be followers. They are really drawn to the person and work of Jesus. They want to be part of the movement, part of the spectacle of his healing and teaching ministry.

Jesus responds in a way that comes across as somewhat harsh, or at least a little too “real.” Foxes and birds have homes in nature, but the Son of Man wanders. It’s a purposeful wandering, but it is a long and uncomfortable wandering, nonetheless. Jesus chose to be a street person, a homeless guy, tied down to nothing and at the same time everything.

With that simple response, Jesus is naming the cost of discipleship. The way is hard. You will be weary. Creature comforts and the closeness of loved ones will be distant memories. The cost is too high for some, and Jesus continues on his path toward Jerusalem and his offering of life to conquer death.

Where does Jesus lay his head? Our spirituality opens us up to the possibility that he lays his head on your heart. He has foraged heaven and earth to nest in you. Also, you have a place to lay your head. You can also nest on the heart of Christ. Rest there. Find your home in the heart of Jesus. Forage around for bits and scraps, let your soul craft a tiny house in Christ. You will be safe and sound.

Dear People of Grace;

In July 2024, we approved \$1.5 million for the renovation of our building, including the addition of a new front entry and narthex, and an outdoor plaza. The plan includes a rebuild of our main restrooms with the addition of two single-use restrooms. Several of our offices are also being reconfigured, and there are improvements planned for the kitchen. We are excited to experience the new feel of our building. These improvements are overdue, and we are so grateful to have the opportunity to put significant resources toward the project.

Grace Lutheran Church was blessed to be the beneficiary of a family trust from the Fox family, originally valued at approximately \$2.5 million. During the first few years of the pandemic, we prayed and wondered how best to use these dollars, although we were met with practical roadblocks to doing actual planning. Over time, we discerned the need to use a majority of these dollars to take care of deferred maintenance items around the property, as well as pursue a renovation. These improvements will open up possibilities for future ministry.

Almost one year has passed since that congregation meeting. Currently, we are anticipating costs to go above our original target. We are seeking the consent of the congregation to release more funds to carry us through completion. Join us directly following our 9:30 worship on Sunday June 29 for a congregation meeting in which we will hear an update from project leaders and anticipated costs moving forward. Our financial position to date will be reported at the congregation meeting, June 29. All voting members of the congregation, please plan to attend.

The next Wenatchee Sings Messiah will include Parts I and II, and is slated for May 8, 2026 and the entire Messiah will be shared in the Spring of 2027.



- ◆ *Erling Rivedal* - receiving hospice care.


