#### Sabbatical Leave

Dear friends in Christ,

I have been preparing for sabbatical leave. The dates: May 1 – July 24, 2020. When I first brought the idea to the Council and my pastoral support team, sabbatical was in the distant future! Now plans are taking shape. I'm looking forward to the different pace and the different space that sabbatical will give me. Here's a quote from "Clergy Renewal: the Alban Guide to Sabbatical Planning"

The question here is what part of the holy do you need to cultivate? What is your learning style? What challenges you?

Sabbatical is a time to receive, to be nurtured, to dig deeper into yourself, your relationship with God, and your own roots and stories, so that you can be renewed, refreshed, and revitalized by the breath of God. Use the creative juices inside you for your journey with the Holy. Let the restlessness be creative. Risk allowing the Spirit to move in you, to call more from you.

In short, sabbatical renewal leave typically includes time for rest, travel, prayer, study, renewing relationships, worship, and living in different cultures.

This is a good way for anyone to approach all of life as a disciple of Jesus to whatever extent possible. A common theme I'm picking up in my planning is the need to receive. At the risk of feeling selfish and greedy, I think it's time to pay more attention to what I receive daily from God, from family and friends, congregation and community, and the world. I think my default setting for self-understanding as pastor is that I am called to be a provider: preaching, teaching, empowering others, caring for others... all this puts me in the position of "giver." It makes sense, since I receive compensation for my work and have gone to school for this kind of work and service. I confess, I do sometimes feel like I am trying to create a product for consumption by the membership.

But as a community we are called to model a different culture. I always want Grace to be a place of rest and renewal and acceptance for all, of pausing to be filled up by the Spirit, a place where folks can be inspired to live in service to the world, not as a work requirement but as a response to the free gift of grace and love given through Jesus. As one of the organizers and workers to create that kind of space, discipleship becomes my occupation – my work. Sabbatical for me is a time to reboot, reset, reorient so I can remember and be strengthened by God, the source of life. A Jewish scholar named Abraham Heschel pointed out that workdays are meant to be inspired by the sabbath day. When one's being is only defined by what they do, there's an emptiness. When one's doing can be built on one's being, there's fullness. For me, it's tricky to maintain that frame of mind, because the holy and sacred are most of my workday. Now, it's time to receive and get a clearer idea of my being. I will build back up from there.

My days off in February: 3, 10, 17, 24.

# "We Are Church, We Are Called: 50-40-10"

# From the desk of Intern Jenna

This year, the ELCA is lifting up a significant celebration: "We Are Church, We Are Called: 50-40-10." The year 2020 marks the anniversary of three prominent milestones in our church's history: 50 years of ordaining\* caucasian women, 40 years of ordaining

women of color and 10 years of ordaining LGBTQIA+ persons. (Not sure what "ordaining" means? See below.)

As a pastoral intern, I have the opportunity to create some kind of "project" during my year at Grace Lutheran. I believe this celebration of the ELCA is important, so I've decided to adopt it as a kind of framework for my intern project. I'm expanding the focus to include lay people (that is, non church workers - all the people of the church) who have experienced being "on the margins," especially women and LGBTQIA+ persons\*\*. In a recent sermon, I shared the idea that we all receive a kind of "ordination" in our baptism; I'd like to move forward with that idea in the spirit of "We Are Church, We Are Called."

Over the next several months, I invite you to join me in reflecting upon what it means to be "on the margins" in our church and greater community and ask ourselves how we can more fully live into the truth that "We Are ALL Church, We Are ALL Called." This will take shape in a number of different ways and unfold more as we go along, together.

Here are a few places where we will lift up ideas and conversation around "We Are Church, We Are Called":

- RIC Sunday, held on January 26
- Grace Readers book club (currently reading "Dear Church" by Lenny Duncan), Wednesdays at 6:30PM
- "Epiphany" youth retreat (with guest speaker & musician Rachel Kurtz), Feb 21-23
- Guest preacher Jamie Bruesehoff, March 8
- Grace Lutheran women's retreat, March 13-15
- "We Are Church, We Are Called" Sunday, date TBD

I hope these next few months will be a time of celebration, introspection and greater understanding as we lift up "We Are Church, We Are Called" together. \*Ordination is an official rite given by the [ELCA] church when one becomes a pastor (so I, Intern Jenna, say I'm "working towards ordination" since I'm not there, just yet). It's a kind of "external call" that formally takes place when one receives their "first call" at a church or church organization after completing seminary (and a few other things - but I won't get into that).

\*\*I do believe Grace Lutheran is already having some of these conversations, especially as we go through the RIC ("Reconciling in Christ") Program. I'm excited to build upon that. - 1. Grace semi-annual meeting was January 26 following the second worship service in the Fellowship Hall (see highlights below).
- 2. Pastor submitted a timeline of expenses for his upcoming Sabbatical for the Council to review.
- 3. We welcomed new council members Cathy Sweeney, Riva Morgan and Ann Bartlett.
- 4. Reviewed Fox Trust update and the sale of the condo has closed effective January 21, 20120

## A few highlights from our January 26, 2020 Congregation Meeting

Treasurer Gwen Sparks reported that we finished 2019 with expenses of approximately \$6,000 over income which we were able to absorb using offerings from past years.

Fox Trust update: Brokerage account is valued at approx. \$2.5 Million. Approx. \$1.5 Million will remain in the brokerage account at UBS, transferred to our name, and \$1 Million will be held in in our name at the ELCA Mission Investment Fund. The condominium sold recently, and proceeds will be received at the brokerage account. The East Wenatchee property has not been sold; we would like to see if Habitat for Humanity would like to make an offer or another possible arrangement.

Special project dollars from previous years' offerings were designated, totaling \$40,000.

The budget for 2020 was adopted.

A first-fruits tithe was approved by the congregation of the Fox Trust gift: 4% of income to be given locally through our Social Concerns team, 3% of income to be gifted to the Northwest Intermountain Synod, 3% of income to be gifted to the ELCA churchwide.

Two projects for facility improvement were given the green light: improving lighting for sanctuary and improving audio for sanctuary.

This is an exciting year ahead of us! Thanks be to God for the prayerful support of the whole congregation.


