Milwaukee, Here We Come

Dear friends in Christ,

In 2018, I was elected to be a voting member of our Synod to the ELCA Churchwide Assembly (I'll call it the CWA in this article). I'm excited to see what the CWA is like. One friend shared with me that he has attended three such assemblies. At one of them, the person sitting next to him for the whole week was Dr. Martin Marty, one of the church's great historians. The CWA is an opportunity to share in community with many members of the Church, hear about God's work, and respond to God's prompting as a decision-making body. I will be at the CWA in Milwaukee August 4-10.

The CWA is part of the three major expressions of our life together as the ELCA. There is, of course, the congregational expression which is the most familiar to folks. The next expression is the synod, which is the partnership we have in our geographic area. Our synod covers mountains, plains, Palouse, small communities and cities. The next expression is the churchwide organization, which works on a national and international level. All expressions are valued and important.

Here's an incomplete list of agenda items for the assembly:

- We will elect a person to the position of ELCA Secretary.
- We will elect a person to the position of ELCA Presiding Bishop. I anticipate the re-election of Elizabeth Eaton, but I don't want to jinx it!
- We will consider a social statement titled "Faith, Sexism and Justice: A Lutheran Call to Action".
- We will consider a statement titled "A Declaration of Inter-Religious Commitment".
- We will work alongside one another on the issue of diversity within the ELCA.
- Our synod name change (to Northwest Intermountain) will be considered for ratification.

Our work will be surrounded with worship experiences and good conversation about the local and global ways God is at work. We are blessed by the lives of one another, and we are challenged to understand ourselves more and more deeply as we feel the call to widen our circles of community. I'm honored to be part of the contingent from Northwest Intermountain.

My days off etc.: August 12, 19, 26. I may grab a vacation day or two, but don't have that settled yet!

Faith Formation Fall 2019

Some things change, and some stay the same! Faith Formation classes for all ages will again be at 9:30 a.m. each Sunday morning. We will kick off the year with **Rally Sunday on September 8**. Join us at 9:30 a.m. on the 8th for some outdoor fun, including cornhole, ladderball and a bouncy house! Classes will begin the next week on Sunday, September 15.

We have a few exciting changes in our format this year!

Preschool/Kindergarten will again meet in the preschool classroom downstairs. We have set up a coffee maker in the youth room across the hall and we encourage parents to hang out, make a latte or cappuccino and visit with other parents.

1st grade thru ??* will meet in the Fellowship hall and participate in a new rotation. We are continuing the theme of Summer of Service, Walking Together.

- * The first Sunday in the rotation, we will have speakers from the agencies we worked with come in and share their stories and the needs of the people they serve. There will be time for questions and then we will come together to brainstorm a service project for that agency. (clothing drive, food drive, toy drive, etc.)
- * The second Sunday will be our Creative Corner. There will be craft supplies and ideas for items that can be given to the folks that the agency serves. (e.g. greeting cards, paper bouquets, duct tape wallets, etc.)
- * The third Sunday in the rotation our projects will be put together and prepared for delivery.
- ??* thru 12th Grade will meet in Narnia and be studying our neighbor's faith. Once a month we will visit a neighboring congregation or faith tradition. The following week we will be discussion on the service/traditions of the other congregation. This group will also be present for the guest speakers of the Walking Together class.
- ??* These groups are fluid. I would invite parents and other adults to participate in the Walking Together class. We will publish a list of upcoming speakers and agencies in September. Middle school youth are welcome to attend either class.

New to Grace: A Series of Faith Formation Retreats

Are you a sixth-grader or older? Would you love to be on retreat with others for the purpose of building community as we learn together about the Catechism, faith practices and the Bible? We are providing an opportunity for ANYONE age 6th grade through adult to be part of a series of retreats throughout the year. It's a two-year cycle, with three retreats each year, supported by small group and prayer-partner experiences. The two-year cycle culminates with Affirmation of Baptism, which occurs on Pentecost Sunday. For those who have been part of our confirmation programming, this series will replace the weekly classes. If you would like to learn more and consider signing up, join us for an information session after worship on Sunday, August 25. We will share the concept of retreat-style learning, details about accommodations, and more.

August Newsletter – from the almost empty desk of Intern Wayne Taking Leave

As you read this, I'll be packing up my desk, my things, the mementos that I've acquired. I'll be going through the box of stuff, trying to make sense of all that has happened in a year. That this year has been a significant one in my life is a 100% true understatement.

Life events have a certain weight to them; things like births, deaths, weddings, big number events like career milestones or anniversaries, all have gravitas as they mark the changes. There are doorways that we pass through or significant changes that stop something and begin something else.

Much of the life at Grace Lutheran Church is about 'starts and stops'. Seasons change, the colors marking liturgical seasons change, the light on the foothills change each day, and the ebb and flow of church life and the lives within and without are in constant states of flux. The building is alive with activity most days of the week. There is energy and ministry that happens in an organized and often organic, spontaneous way. It is beautiful to watch and more beautiful to be a part of it. Beginnings and endings. Time to change interns.

Janet and I have been blessed by you and by the trust that you have extended to us, in ministry and life. The changes that have occurred in me and my sense of ministry have been amazing to experience. Sometime during this year, the scale tipped from "Intern" to "Pastor" and I can never go back to being the old me. Each and every one of you have contributed to my becoming a pastor more and an intern less.

I will soon stop being "the intern" and become the former intern, or the last intern, or THAT intern. In order to be called as a pastor, I must complete a few more classes (four) and get approved by the faculty and the candidacy committee of Upstate New York Synod (in December). First, though, I have to stop being an intern completely. It means letting go of a happy and wonderful experience, having a few good cries, and maybe a few glasses of shared wine.

It's not exactly what the apostle Paul meant when he wrote it, but this verse carries a special meaning and place in my heart.

"18 I believe that the present suffering is nothing compared to the coming glory that is going to be revealed to us. 19 The whole creation waits breathless with anticipation for the revelation of God's sons and daughters. 20 Creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice—it was the choice of the one who subjected it—but in the hope 21 that the creation itself will be set free from slavery to decay and brought into the glorious freedom of God's children." – Romans 8:18-21 CEB

Thank you, one and all. You have shown me what a congregation can be, and what being committed to living in the Gospel can mean. I am grateful and will remember you always.
