There's a Boulder on the Highway

"Hang in there." (probably from Jesus)

Dear friends in Christ,

The flow of information has been met with challenges these days. The virus has scrambled our regular channels, in a sense. People aren't meeting face to face, sharing news about the ministry of the church. We are left with distant-feeling options like email, newsletter articles, Facebook posts, and video-taped announcements. The mental image I have now is of a bus-sized boulder resting happily on a highway. The way is not smooth.

Here are some updates. I'll mention a few boulders as a way to be vulnerable in writing, and to ask for your help and prayer.

Yes, we do have a student arriving for a year of internship. Bergen Nelson and his soon-to-be wife Clara will arrive the week of August 18. *Boulders: It's important for Bergen to have in-person relationships, but the risks make it complicated. The intern committee needs three more members (now) and a leader starting January. If the committee is in a fragile state and there is no leadership, Bergen's experience is less than it should be, and his internship is actually at risk. Also selfishly, Jenna had been putting together the worship services with her computer, and now that responsibility is mine. There's a shift in workload.*

Jameson is launching into another field of work. His gifts of organization and musical hospitality have blessed our community for five years. *Boulders: Our organist Judy is high risk, so I hesitate to ask her to come to church to record hymns for our online worship. I also know there's a learning curve to record in a digital format, build a hymn file that includes the words to the verses and send to me for adding to the worship. Also, Jameson and Judy have been selecting hymns for the last five years. This is now my responsibility.*

Our constitution requires that we have a congregational meeting in September. *Boulders: We cannot have a proxy system. The constitution presumes in-person meetings. How should we organize for that? There need to be elections too, and the nominating committee is an empty committee currently. If I were to become more directly involved, I would go back to my notes and pick up where we left off about a year ago.*

We hosted several groups at our facility on a weekly basis. *Boulder: The preschool has a hoped-for start date of September 8. They need to plan, but we haven't gotten to phase 2 yet, and our guidelines don't allow gatherings inside even in that phase. How do we work with the preschool and navigate all the needs of our congregation and the network of organizations that use our property?*

Picking our way around boulders is a slow, ankle-twisting, reptile-friendly business that requires us to look down and lose the horizon. Be bolder, be healthy, and be safe, dear people of Grace! Hang in there.

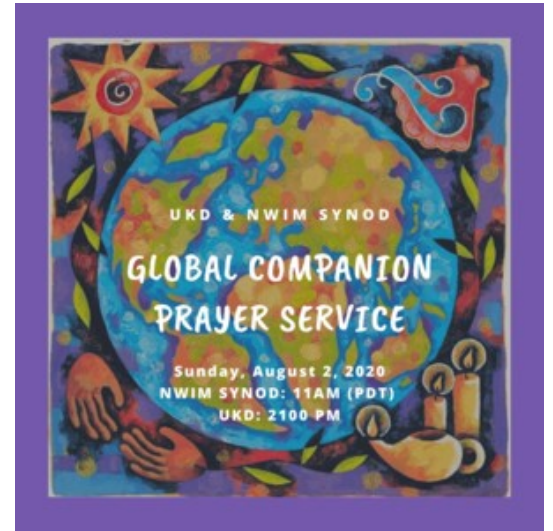

Our recent circumstances, including the disruption of our daily, weekly, and monthly patterns, have me reconsidering how I measure time. Clocks and calendars help organize a schedule, but they also force a certain structure that can affect how we perceive our lives. Here in the valley, I have sometimes chosen to measure life by season and activity. Snow and skiing lead to foothill hiking and wildflowers. Then, hiking heads up to higher altitudes and alpine lakes and peaks appear. Cherries, apricots, apples, and berries follow and eventually the larches lead back to hoping for snowfall and skiing.



I have also measured my life in terms of community and belonging. My hometown makes up the first significant section of my life and schools, churches, and communities add texture and landmarks along the way. I am incredibly grateful to have belonged to this community called Grace Lutheran Church for the past five years. When I arrived, I knew so little about this remarkable place, the people who call it home, and just how much I would need all of you. With love, support, and warmth you have made space for me to belong and to become a part of this community. For that, I will always give thanks. You have also changed me and pushed me to grow in ways that I could not have anticipated. I am who I am, in part, because you are who you are.

The past few months have brought about the beginning of a new chapter for all of us, perhaps a new volume even. As we face transition and change, it can be comforting to know that communities hold experience, wisdom, and resilience that can seem scarce from an individual's viewpoint. The community of Grace is what it is because you are who you are, and who you have been, together.

It is with this in mind that I tell you I am also headed towards a new personal chapter. I have accepted a teaching position in Quincy and will start that new work this fall. I will still be here in the valley, but my role in the life of Grace will change. I am eager to bring what I have learned with you to my teaching. I am also thankful that I am able to continue participating in the life of this valley and the community here.

I am so proud of who you are and who you are becoming. There is a particular light that radiates and shines at Grace. Even though the stained-glass windows help make it apparent, I am convinced that the light comes from within the people. Let your light so shine. This world needs it and I will be forever grateful that I carry a small part of it with me.

Members in Need Fund:



With current events regarding COVID-19, we acknowledge that some of our members will experience financial difficulties. There is a confidential process for financial help for our members and people who are involved in our faith community. Applications are reviewed by a small committee consisting of the Pastor, Council President, and team leader of the Social Concerns Team.

Families in Need Update:

As many of you know the Social Concerns Team has been working with Families in Need in our local community. Families that need assistance are identified by school advocates or members of Grace can refer a family.

Currently the Social Concerns Team is working with two families. The adult members of Family L have gone back to work part time. Family L wants to try making it on their own and if they need assistance, they will contact team members.

Family P has 7 members in the family. Five members of Family P are working the night shift at Stemilt. Two of them are high school age and one is in her 70's. The mother and grandmother do not speak English, but the children are able to translate. The children are extremely interested in helping their Mother and Grandmother. The father passed away a few years back. Members of the Social Concerns Team delivered Grocery Outlet Gift Cards totaling \$800, along with four portable a/c units. The housing situation for Family P is not great. Unfortunately, the landlord is not willing to make needed repairs or call in an exterminator. Members of the Social Concerns Team have helped the family get on a couple of housing rental lists. Just a reminder - Cash position was reduced by \$40,000 at 12/31/19 and the Special Projects fund was established, thus the large variance in cash available between 2019 and 2020. Not including the \$40,000, 6/30/20 cash position is \$59,810 and 6/30/19 cash position was \$95,082.

Offerings continue to run behind projected budget. Offering budget expectation through 6/30 was \$257,500 while 2020 actual is \$203,242. Expenses have been less than budget. Budget projected expenses through 6/30 were \$267,360; actual expenses are \$240,363. Overall operating loss through 6/30/20 is (\$37,122).

Payroll Protection Program. GLC was able to participate in program with SBA loan of \$72,300. I am now in the processing of completing paperwork to request forgiveness of this loan. Monies were available to stabilize payroll expenses during church closure.

Council Corner

1. Fox Trust East Wenatchee Property closing with final gift to Grace of \$171,000. Grace to disburse final 10% tithe portion to ELCA, NWIM Synod and Social Concerns.
2. Grace will be purchasing a used van using Special Project monies approved in January to provide a more reliable church vehicle in addition to the current van. No plans have been made to sell/ gift the current church van.
3. Richard Foss gifted GLC an inheritance in the amount of \$5,000 that will be added to Grace's savings as an undesignated gift.
4. Marian Huggins gifted GLC an inheritance in the amount commensurate with 13% of the total estate value. Amount (TBD) will be added to Grace's savings as an undesignated gift.
