Pastor's Message

Dear friends,

We are at the ending and the beginning of another year of internship here at Grace. We were blessed to know Bergen and his spouse Clara, and we trust that our friendship and partnership in ministry will continue for many, many years to come. Soon, we will welcome Anna Ferro to our community. Like all pastoral interns at Grace, Anna will be a blessing to us. We will "do what we do" and provide for her the best learning experience possible. Here are a few things I want to say about the role of the internship site.

- 1. The intern is a student. Anna will be practicing leadership, will be in leadership roles, but always in the context of being a learner. You are one of her teachers. I am one of her teachers. She will have much to offer the community because the gifts she brings are unique to her, but some experiences will be quite new to her. Our internship site is part of her education.
- 2. Grace is something we practice. Pastoral interns are encouraged to be courageous in how they practice ministry. They are encouraged to be innovative and imaginative and try new ideas on for size. There will be times when the pastoral intern feels badly about how something went. We are people of Grace, and we are called to practice grace to provide emotional and spiritual safety for the intern as she continues her path of internship. Personally, I think the life of faith would be better off if the words "success" and "failure" dropped from its lexicon, but I know those words will be used. I simply encourage you to help Anna know that underneath every element of pastoral formation there is both the love of Christ and the love of the Body of Christ, which is you.
- 3. Ministry is work, and there are times the pastoral intern will need to unplug and rejuvenate. Anna will grow to love the congregation, and you will love her. These relationships will develop quickly, and many invitations will come her way. If she is hesitant about meeting up for a meal or outing, please do not be offended. She will want to be present for you emotionally, and that means caring for herself by creating blocks of time to be unavailable.
- 4. The internship committee exists to be a support system for the intern, to delve into topics that may be confidential in nature, and to generally reflect with the intern from the congregational point of view. The committee helps the intern feel welcome and oriented to the congregation and the community. They also write mid-year and final evaluations of the intern as part of the internship program.
- 5. As you introduce yourself to Anna, be sure to use your name often until she becomes more familiar with the whole congregation.

Thank you for being part of the ministry of internship at Grace! You have a role in helping Anna have a wonderful year here in our community.

SOCIAL CONCERNS TEAM

Lithuanian Christian College



One of the Benevolences that the Social Concerns Team chose to accept this year is LCC International University (LCC), commonly known as the Lithuanian Christian College, located in Lithuania. The following is a summary of the College and what they do.

LCC International University (LCC) is a nationally and internationally recognized Christian liberal arts university located in Klaipeda, Lithuania, a port city on the Baltic Sea. Established in 1991 — as a result of the Soviet Union's collapse — by a joint venture of Lithuanian, Canadian and American foundations, LCC has distinguished itself in the region by offering a unique style of education that is based on American educational practices and values. Nearly 1,000 students, faculty, and staff from over 50 countries come together within our learning community — speaking the common language of English — while

learning to accept their cultural differences through Christ's love.

The mission of LCC is to provide Christian liberal arts education within a diverse learning community that transforms people for servant leadership. We are committed to the historic Christian faith, which is expressed in the ecumenical creeds. These creeds were formulated in the early centuries of Christian history, prior to the division of the church into Orthodox, Catholic, and Protestant (or evangelical) branches. They are shared expressions of our common Christian faith. This is a statement that is affirmed by all faculty.

As a university that connects to various Christian communities in the city and the region, we have become known as a safe place for conversation across Christian traditions. We've hosted church leaders' forums and conferences in which leaders from a variety of Christian traditions come together in community. We continue to host the Global Leadership Summit (now in our 11th year), again providing a place for open dialogue, often in the follow-up sessions to the conference.

We encourage our students to be involved in local churches of every Christian tradition. We ensure that the information regarding these churches is readily available to students, and we work at building relationships with the faith leaders so that LCC is known to them. We regularly involve local church leaders in our large events, such as graduation, often asking them to participate from the stage. Our professors are regular contributors to the local churches, regularly preaching and teaching there as well.

We have a robust Spiritual Life program, which includes up to 20 Bible Studies at any given time (about half led by faculty/staff, and half led by students), weekly chapel as well as worship nights, and a highly active Alpha class (conversational introduction to Christian principles). In addition, this year we have placed students as Discipleship Assistants on each floor of the residence halls, thereby engaging students in spiritual dialogue where they live. We are very clear, as a Christ-centered university, that we engage in an invitational approach to faith conversations, not a coercive approach. While all students (no exceptions) take 4 classes from the Theology Department, no student is required to accept the professors' words or claim certain theological beliefs to pass the courses. We believe that these 4 years of university life are the best incubator for students as they begin to ask the big questions of life and we are privileged to walk alongside them as they do so. And we are deeply grateful for each student, no matter what stage they are at in their faith journey.

Thank you for your support of the LCC mission. Although there are many Christian colleges and universities spread throughout North America, LCC is the only liberal arts Christian university in Europe and therefore the only link that many students have with a Christian community and the Word of God. The support of Grace Lutheran Church is deeply appreciated in our efforts to continue in this important work.

Smoke Removal Fans

Members of Grace Lutheran Church along with the First United Methodist Church is helping to distribute fans to homes that need wildfire smoke removal. We are providing Box Fans with a filter system. These fans can pull smoke out of a house, without HVAC, when there are fires/smoke. The most vulnerable population is our migrant workers as well as our immigrant population. They are often overlooked or cannot afford such things.
