Christmas Light, Inviting Us Through Advent

People of Grace;

Kathy and Curt Gavin hosted a gathering last month at their home. We had appetizers, Advent and wine. It was a delightful evening of 10-15 people of Grace. We shared Advent and Christmas memories. We imagined Advent themes together. We sang together and reflected on Advent scriptures too. There was deep sharing among us, and a real spirit of togetherness. I was so glad to be part of it. Thank you, Kathy and Curt, for your hospitality!

Here are a few thoughts about Advent that came from that evening:

1. Advent has movement. People stream to the Holy City. There is movement related to pregnancy. There are journeys. There is a making of peace and instruments of peace. In many ways, Advent movement is a belabored kind. We are not necessarily light on our feet when on the Advent journey. There is much that weighs us down.
2. Advent has hopeful expectation. In contrast to another somber season (Lent), Advent is less about the end of things and more about the beginning of things. If Lent is about death (think of Good Friday), then Advent is about life (think of the experience of being born). The quiet agitation of Advent is unique in our church calendar. Advent is an alternative to the instant satisfaction and gratification that's so accessible to us in our society of today. We are “now people” being invited to practice “not yet”. It's all about anticipation.
3. Advent has attentiveness. Each of us are invited to expand the reach of our senses so as to notice subtle changes in the all-too-familiar. We are also invited to ask a very deep question: “What's it going to be like?” “How will things be different?” Yes, we have Christmas every year, but the entrance of Christ as the light of the world is never insignificant.

I believe the light of Christmas is inviting us through Advent. The longest shadows are the ones behind us.

A Note from the Finance Manager

This is a reminder to all members that for donations to be included in 2022, they must be in the Finance Manager's office (not Jen's office) or postmarked by December 31, 2022. The church offices will be closed December 26-December 30, so you may drop offerings in the (locked) mailbox outside the church office door by midnight December 31.

For those of you who use your bank's billpayer – make sure that you give adequate time for the billpayer donations to be processed and mailed. Some billpayer processing and mailings can be delayed for up to 2 weeks. Billpayer offerings received after January 6 will be attributed to 2023 donations.

Please be aware that our Church360 program that tracks donations is not capable of splitting donations from a single check over 2 years. If you wish to donate for more than one year, please have separate checks issued.

Beginning January 1st, please discontinue use of the 2022 offering envelopes and use the 2023 envelopes instead. Thank you.

Team Leaders: Please note that the office will be closed the week of December 26-30. To have payments included in the 2022 budget, signed vouchers must be in my office no later than December 16. I will process the checks December 19 to be signed by the 20th and mailed on the 23rd, which will be the last day I work before the Christmas Holidays. Thank you!

Household Goods. Regarding donations of household goods, everyone has been so generous. The storage room at the First United Methodist Church is full to the brim. Therefore, at this time, Friends of Ukraine Refugees is not accepting donations of furniture, kitchen supplies, clothing, or other household goods. When a specific need arises, we will announce it.

New Homes for Newcomer Refugees. On November 10, Geraldine Warner, Suzi Pitts, Dee Ann Gregg, and Val Nikishin completed the moving-in of the refugee family of Mr. and Mrs. Donskykh, a family of five and soon to be six (baby due in January). Not only was the moving completed, so was the furniture, all donated, moved in and beds made. Way to go, team! The rented house is in East Wenatchee, with the monthly rent being paid by Friends of Ukraine Refugees. In addition, on November 13, thanks to the generosity of Sara and Dean O'Daffer, we secured a small house ADU on Madison Street near Washington School for Mr. and Mrs. Dotsenko, ages 62 and 57. The house is fully furnished, equipped, and will be perfect for two people. There is no rent. Just \$100 a month to cover utilities for four months. Friends of Ukraine Refugees will pay the monthly utilities and damage deposit. By the end of the term, we will make sure that Mr. and Mrs. Dotsenko have found a permanent rental. The occupancy of the house helps both the landowner and the tenants during the winter, and Mr. and Mrs. Dotsenko understand that their occupancy ends on or before March 31. This move-in, including the signing of the lease, was finalized by Dee Ann Gregg, Slavic Belchenko, Mr. and Mrs. O'Daffer, and the professional interpreter, Olya Erho.
