To whom then will you compare me, or who is my equal? says the Holy One. Lift up your eyes on high and see: Who created these? He who brings out their host and numbers them, calling them all by name; because he is great in strength, mighty in power, not one is missing. (Isaiah 40:25-26)

Dear friends in Christ,

We have a God who is great in strength, mighty in power. One surprising way this is displayed, is to say that God is great at keeping inventory. The above passage likely refers to the stars in the night sky (calling them all by name), but it is very appropriate to think about the whole human family along with all of creation when we hear these sweet words: "not one is missing."

Israeli captives in Gaza – not one is missing. Palestinian young people who join the violent, extremist Hamas – not one is missing. Houseless high school students going from one friend's couch to another, barely able to hold attention at school – not one is missing. Many others who have landed in desperate situations, - not one is missing.

You also are not missing. In the heart of God, you are not missing. Where your body, mind and spirit go (even if all in separate directions) – you are not missing. If you are lost – you are not missing. I hope you can spread this word to people around you, reminding them that they are not missing.

Blessed Lent to you. I hope you are able to participate in our worship life this season.

Our Wednesday vespers service is adapted from the Iona Community of Scotland. We will have opportunities to hear healing stories from the Gospel of Mark, and will be invited for the laying-on of hands with prayers for healing. Please join us!

Songs from the Early 19th Century

7:00 p.m. Friday, February 9

Melissa Schiel, Mezzo-soprano, and Tamara Caulkins, Classical Guitar, will present a program of early nineteenth-century Spanish songs, French chansons, and Italian operas by renowned early 19th-century composer Fernando Sor (1778-1839). The concert will take place at Grace Lutheran Church at 7:00 p.m. on Friday, February 9. The concert is free of charge with donations welcome. The program will include a lively mix of songs for voice and guitar.

Canadian Mezzo-soprano Melissa Schiel has established herself in the Pacific Northwest as a concert soloist, stage performer, and recitalist. She has performed with chamber groups and orchestras including Beethoven's Symphony No.9 with Yakima Symphony and Handel's Messiah with Wenatchee Valley Symphony, the Fairbanks Symphony Orchestra, Rainer Symphony Orchestra, Seattle Metropolitan Chamber Orchestra, and Orchestra Seattle.



Tamara Caulkins, Guitar, specializes in historically-informed performances of early nineteenth-century music. She has conducted research in archives in France, Spain, and the U.S. to recover long-lost music for guitar, guitar and voice, and chamber music with guitar. Tamara has also studied eighteenth-century dance and has performed with Seattle Early Dance, Musica Antiqua, and the Musicking festival in Eugene, Oregon.

February 18 is A Capella Sunday

Worshipping communities around the world mark the first Sunday in Lent as A Capella Sunday. At Grace Lutheran, we sing well unaccompanied. Our worship experience on February 18 will hopefully encourage us all as we join in this growing ecumenical tradition.



Why sing a capella? 4 reasons:

- 1. Many Christians around the world have no instruments to accompany their worship. This gives us an opportunity to experience that, and rejoice in what we DO have.
- 2. The experience of a cappella singing offers us an opportunity to reflect on the strength of singing together.
- 3. When singing without instruments, we listen differently, and hear the corporate sound far more powerfully than with accompaniment.
- 4. Instruments provide inspiration and leadership, but take a secondary role to your singing voices. 5.

We move to ELW Setting 4 of the liturgy for this Lenten season, and we know that musical setting well. When we sing the hymns, you'll note that the choir or a soloist (leading from the center of the worship space) will always introduce each of them - with humming, singing a preparatory phrase, or jumping right in as marked. We trust you'll find that adding different colors and textures to our songs will keep them interesting.

May we find blessings in our corporate prayer and praise as we sing familiar songs in a new way.

Singer? Ringer? Can't make a long-term choir commitment?

Prayerfully consider singing/ringing for a season: Lent (including Holy Week), from Feb. 14-March 30 Easter (including Pentecost), from March 31-May 19

Little Free Pantry Food Drive

There has been a high use of the pantry this winter, and since we are no longer able to acquire food from Chelan Douglas Community Action, we are in need of donations more than ever before. So, during Lent to go along with our hunger emphasis, we will be collecting food items for our Little Free Pantry. We appreciate all the items you are providing, and we make them stretch as far as possible. For example, if you leave a box of 12 Top Ramen packages, we break down that box and just put out one or two a day. We have found that the Dollar Tree is an economical place to purchase toiletries, cleaning supplies, and milk that doesn't need refrigeration. Another bargain place is the Franz Bakery Outlet where bread products are very reasonably priced. During Lent we would like to emphasize the following items: toilet paper, diapers (all sizes), baby wipes, peanut butter, rice, and beans.
